Confirmation is an opportunity for students in 8th grade to explore their own faith and learn more about the Bible, Christianity, and The United Methodist Church. NEW CHILDREN'S MINISTRY FORMAT FOR THE FALL

A team of people invested in children's ministry met and has redesigned our Sunday morning Children's Ministry to meet the needs of the children and families in our church and community. Starting on September 18th, children will begin in worship and then will be invited to stay or go to Stepping Stones (infant through age 3) or Kids GROW – (age 4 through 5th Grade). On Communion Sundays, children will return for Communion. The Kids GROW class will include large group activities, worship (song/prayer), and small group discussions (divided by ages). This format gives all children an opportunity to participate in corporate worship, work individually or together on an activity with different ages, and then discuss the story/theme in age appropriate ways. At least six youth and adults will be needed each Sunday to provide leadership for both the Stepping Stones and Kids GROW classes. Please contact Rev. Kathy for more information.

Dear Friends,

King Solomon, who ruled Israel for forty years beginning approximately 967 B.C., was known for his wisdom, his wealth and his writings. He left us a trilogy of wisdom writings in our Old Testament – Proverbs, Ecclesiastes and Song of Solomon. His literature is considered a genre within our scripture known as Wisdom Literature. Wisdom Literature is concerned with living life optimally in a world and with others we do not fully understand. Author and Roman Catholic priest, Richard Clifford, writes, “The wisdom books remind readers that one must take hold of life as both gift and task, that there are many possibilities but also profound limits, and that honest observation and fidelity to one’s experience of life can put one in touch with a wondrous order whose source is God.”

Arguably, the most famous of Solomon’s writings is the third chapter of Ecclesiastes. This portion of scripture begins, “For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up

what is planted; a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance.” These pairings of possibilities goes on and other than “a time to be born, and a time to die” they represent decisions we human beings make.

Perhaps these ancient words led to the axiom, “Timing is everything!” The purpose of this reflection on the Wisdom of Solomon is to recognize that timing is everything. Our church has been working toward many different goals as a part of our participating in the Vital Church Initiative (VCI).

One of those goals is launching a new contemporary setting for worship which we have named The Conversation.

Originally, we were going to publically launch that service on October 9; about a month after beginning that service for our congregation in September.

Up to this point, we have not been able to secure a very necessary part of The Conversation experience: . . . a Worship Leader who will facilitate The Conversation and provide a connection with those we hope to reach.

This is a time for your pastor to say, “Timing is everything!” Therefore we are

delaying the launch of The Conversation until December 4, 2016. According to our VCI Coach, Rev. Tonya Arnesen, and other experts in the field of worship, Advent offers another opportunity to reach out to the community with a new ministry. The public launch on December 4 means that we will begin this worship experience on November 6 or 13. This decision was made with counsel from leaders working in VCI and in the area of worship and it was not taken lightly. This change in our plans offers us some additional time to come together with our two different services on September 18 and produce some momentum toward our December 4 launch.

The schedule for our worship services beginning on September 18 is on the front part of the Chimes. You will also find the schedule for November 6 or 13 when we begin The Conversation.

As we prepare for a very busy fall schedule and the beginning of cherished programs as well as new programs and studies, I ask that you pray for the leadership of our church. Please pray for me and your very dedicated Staff. Pray for those who are not yet a part of our church family!
