Dear Friends,

You may be familiar with the Old English proverb, “You can never have too many friends.” A Russian Proverb is very similar, “There’s no such thing as too many friends.” Of course this sentiment offers appreciation for supportive relationships and the assurance that our burdens can be shared with our friends as our joys are multiplied through our friends. Yet, I am moved to ask a question when contemplating these proverbs. Are they true? Do we, in fact, believe that we can never have too many friends? Is this true within our church?

One of my “Mannschreck Maxims” is, “Even the friendliest church isn’t as friendly as they think.” Before you judge my words as negative and cynical, let me explain my meaning. It is my belief that all churches, when it comes to friendliness, openness and hospitality, can improve. Even those churches most call “so friendly” and “nice.”

While accessing the strengths and growth areas of a church I was sent to serve (not Central), I recognized that the church was very friendly and was comprised of many large families. Everyone joked that I dare not say a negative word about

anyone in the church, because “we’re all related!” While I had initially deemed the friendliness and those large families as a strength of the church, which it was; I also had to admit that the church’s friendliness was also a cause for concern.

Each Sunday morning, when visitors would join us for worship and the coffee fellowship following, I would watch our wonderful members and friends greet each other and check in with each other. All the while, I might be the only person to make sure that a visitor – a stranger in our midst – was greeted and made to feel welcomed. I remember one well-meaning parishioner saying to me, “Hey Jack, I think that couple over there is new. You better go over and meet them.”

I was engaged in a conversation and unwittingly did the right thing when I responded, “Okay – but I have to finish this conversation. Why don’t you go over and meet them first? I’ll come over in a minute.” What happened was that well-meaning parishioner discovered that he liked meeting new people and learned that he had the gift of hospitality. It was the beginning of a great adventure of caring for those new to our congregation.

Here’s my point friends: We may say “You can never have too many friends.” but we act like we don’t need any more friends. We check in with those we know best to the detriment of not meeting new people and ultimately not meeting those new people’s needs.

Bob Farr, Doug Anderson and Kay Kotan write in their book, “Get Their Name Grow Your Church by Building New Relationships:”

One of the biggest risks for every mainline Christian is in spending all of our time with those who are already Christian. We reward our pastors specifically for spending time with those who are already connected in the church. If, in fact, a pastor decides to spend significant time in the mission field, he or she will likely receive significant pushback from the congregation: “Why don’t you care about us? Isn’t it more important to take care of us first?”

Beginning August 21, I will begin a series of message from the book I’ve just quoted, “Get Their Name Grow Your Church by Building New Relationships.” There is a four-week study that accompanies that series of message. While there will be some groups that will be meeting at the church at various time, we would encourage
