Dear Friends in Christ,

We have returned from Traverse City and the Michigan Area Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church. Rev. Kathy and I attended because we are clergy members of the Conference (as we are no longer a member of any single congregation). Myke Robson, Rainy Stephenson and Mark Strobel were Lay Delegates from our church. Angela Arnold and Nick Arnold attended as district-at-large members. Nancy Arnold and Cathy Hazen were there because of their work with our Conference Board of Ordained Ministry. Rich Pittenger and Kristen Gillette were also at Annual Conference because of their work as Conference staff. Hannah Hazen (Cathy's granddaughter and Sara's niece) was one of the photographers for the conference. What a beautiful place for God's people to gather!

Because we are not yet a single Annual Conference, there were moments when we experienced two Annual Conferences meeting at the same time! It was wonderful to work together with our sisters and brothers from the West Michigan Conference and there was a mix of anxiety

and blessing as we begin to work together bringing our unique ways and traditions together.

A definite highlight of the Conference was the leadership of our new Bishop. Bishop David A. Bard led our Annual Conference with wisdom, grace and humor. During his opening worship message, he proclaimed, "Your Bishop is a basket case!" He explained the stress of experiencing his election as Bishop, saying goodbyes and hellos, and the overall stress of all the transitions.

The scripture Bishop Bard reflected on was Luke 9:10-17, the Feeding of the Five Thousand; the only miracle that is recorded in all four gospels. It is a miracle that contains many miracles within it from the use of just five barley loaves and two fish to feed five thousand to the opening of the disciples' eyes to God's grace that works Jesus and through them, to the gathering of 12 baskets of leftover bread after all ate their fill. Bishop Bard, reflecting on this well known miracle transformed the image of himself as a basket case to a basket full of God's grace. He encourages all who follow Jesus to be containers full of God's blessings for others. I love this image! It reminds me of the age

old saying, "We are imperfect vessels of God's perfect grace." When the Apostle Paul asked God to removed his suffering, Paul heard a word from the Lord, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." Paul reflects, "So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me."

When I think about the fact that there has been so much work done to bring two Annual Conferences together and that there is so much more to do, I fully rely on Bishop Bard's proclamation that we are all basket cases — but that we are able to bear God's grace for one another and the world!

Join me in praying for our new Conference — The Michigan Area of the United Methodist Church. Join me in praying for our Bishop, the many clergy and lay leaders in our conference and for each church that is coming together to make our denomination a vital presence in our state and in our world! I look forward to seeing you in worship.
