Dear Friends in Christ,

What's the first thing you think about when you read or hear the word "camp"? Some immediately cringe just thinking about bugs, mud, sand, heat, tents, fire, sunscreen, bug spray, camp meals, or creepy crawly things. Others get super excited about being in nature, meeting new friends, swimming, being silly, and getting away from the normal routine. Going to camp, at any age, provides opportunities for building relationships, finding a safe space, going deeper in faith, and participating in new activities. Children and youth grow in their selfconfidence and faith.



Attending summer camp is a highlight for many of the kids and youth in our congregation. Some are ready to sign up as soon as the new brochure comes out,

while others need a little more coaxing and reassurance that it will be a great experience. Many people from our congregation have been or are currently in places of leadership at summer camp. Because we know the importance of camp, we dedicate a Sunday morning to learning about camp, hearing from campers, and collecting donations for camp scholarships. Every child, youth, and adult who is active at Central UMC is eligible to apply for a camp scholarship from CUMC. We are committed to covering half the cost of camp. The average cost for a week of camp ranges between \$400 and \$500 (with some a little more or less). Camp Scholarships enable us to support our children, youth, and adults with new experiences, relationships, and opportunities to build relationships and faith.

Another way you can support camp is as a camp counselor. If you enjoy working

with children or youth and would like to work at a summer camp, talk with Rev. Kathy for more information. Sunday, April 23 is Camp Sunday. Everyone is encouraged to wear camp clothes or dress casually. We will hear stories about camp and take a special offering for CUMC Camp Scholarships. As a young person I attended camp for 9 or 10 years. Each camp experience was unique and life-changing. I will be forever grateful for the people from my childhood church who supported campers and shaped my faith story. I pray you will be called to do the same for our children and youth.
