reetings from the North Woods of Michigan!

I am writing you from Camp Kinawind where I am leading what is called the Vintage Woods Camp for older elementary children (Grades 4-6). Our son, Jonathan, and Charlotte Murphy are counseling with me. Our theme is Branching Out – Connecting Through Christ. Using the words of Jesus from chapter 15 in John's gospel, we are concentrating on the fact that there are special places in our lives. A special place that we don't often think about is ourselves – our bodies, minds and souls. So we are sharing with our campers that our very lives are "places" where good things can happen and that God and Jesus live within us.

Nature is a wonderful place to explore God's presence. Through creation we learn to trust the Creator. Jesus, when telling his followers not to be anxious about their lives, told them "Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?" (Matthew 6:26) We can begin to trust the creator because of the way in which nature cares for itself, is healed and gives life.

During our first swim time a young camper needed a "buddy" in the shallow area, so we were in the shallow area swimming-or rather splashing aroundwhen we both spotted the shell of a crayfish. Crayfish molt their outer shell in late June. We retrieved the shell from the water and brought it to the shore to show others our new-found treasure. As we were approaching the other campers, my young friend found yet another crayfish shell! From that time on, we were Darwin and Cousteau exploring the shallow water for interesting rocks, shells, minnows and other marvels of God's good earth. I spotted a plant on the shore and asked my fellow scientist if she knew what it was; she didn't. I took a leaf from the plant, rubbed it between my fingers and invited her to smell it. Her eyes lit up and she nearly yelled, "Peppermint!"

This summer, we've begun a message series on The Apostles' Creed. By the time many of you receive this message we will be nearly a third of the way through those ten messages. I want to thank Ernie Bauer for sharing a message on the first part of that Creed: "I believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth." That first part of the Creed is what has inspired my thoughts as I write to you from Camp. The Rev. Rich Peacock will

be speaking later in the series next month.

The purpose of the Creed is to recognize the beliefs that all followers of Jesus Christ hold in common. It is also a way to share the faith. It is my hope that you are enjoying the series as we talk about faith and how it affects our daily living. Creeds recognize all that God has done for us and are, in part, our loving response.

Before concluding, I want to share the thoughts of Father Killian J. Healy (1912-2003), who was a Carmelite priest. Father Healy shared that creation was God's first missionary. He uses the words of the Apostle Paul as a reminder: "Ever since the creation of the world his eternal power and divine nature, invisible though they are, have been understood and seen through the things he has made." (Romans 1:20a)

It is my prayer during these summer months that you will seek God in and through nature as we seek to understand all that God has done for us through our study of The Apostles' Creed. I look forward to seeing you in worship.
