ear Friends,

Please don't blame the messenger, but we all know it's the truth. Summer is nearly over. We are halfway through August, and the start-up of our fall programs are only weeks away. In just a few weeks, our bell and vocal choirs will be rehearsing, our liturgical dancers will be at the front of the sanctuary practicing, and some new book and Bible studies will begin, while other studies continue.

While I am already missing the warmer and longer days of summer, I am excited for what we have planned for Central Church this fall. I've spent these past few weeks working with various groups to create and finalize new directions for our ministries. In July we had a meeting of our church's leadership. We talked about the future of our church and examined our ministries in terms of their alignment to our Mission:

Connecting with God. Connecting with Others. Changing our World with Christ's love.

On Tuesday, August 1, leadership met again to work through a process of planning called "Appreciative Inquiry." Appreciative Inquiry is a positive approach to discover what we do well, and dream where what our ministry should be. We then design a process of moving toward that dream. Both the meetings in July and August created energy in terms of moving forward in our ministry.

In July we also planned our worship programs for Advent and Lent, as well as the messages through June of next year. Those Sunday morning worship experiences are also planned in terms of the music and other worship arts presentations that will be offered.

Rev. Kathy and I have made plans for our Youth Ministry on Sunday afternoons, inclusive of our Confirmation and Tween Programs. We've worked out a schedule for a new Discipleship Bible Study that is flexible enough that we both will be able to teach Seasonal Studies for Advent and Lent. I am also beginning a program of group Spiritual Direction the first Monday evening of each month.

There is much to partake of here at Central UMC! On Sunday, August 6, I mentioned that our Rally Day will be very different in terms of being an actual Open House for our neighbors and friends. You will be asked to both be present at Rally Day, September 10 (this is our Open House) and to invite your neighbors, friends and extended family. There will be opportunity to learn about our various ministries and sign up to participate in those ministries. As with many of our past Rally Days, there will be ample opportunity for fellowship, fun and food!

Yes, it's sad that summer is closing; school will be beginning and our programs will be underway. Yet, there is much to celebrate as we move forward with a vital ministry, meeting both our needs as a community of faith, and the needs of those in the communities where we live, work and play. I look forward to seeing you in worship.
