Practice Intentional Discipleship in 2018

As 2017 draws to a close we begin to think about the New Year. Many of us are involved in finalizing next year's budgets and planning for 2018. This time is ideal for us to also think about out "Faith Plan" for 2018.

As Methodists we are encouraged to practice "intentional discipleship," but what does that mean? From the book *Developing an Intentional Discipleship System: A Guide for Congregations* from Discipleship Ministries of The United Methodist Church:

"A disciple is one who knows Christ, is growing in Christ, serving Christ and sharing Christ."

This includes connecting to Christ in a personal way and being intentional about seeking out those ways to connect on a regular basis. During this season of Stewardship, examine your relationship with Christ and His church and ask:

- How can I put my God-given talents to work for His Kingdom?
- How can I personally grow closer to Christ through prayer and study?
- How can I practice generosity regularly throughout the year?

As you're thinking about your Faith Plan, keep in mind that Central offers a number of ways for you to grow in your faith and discipleship. These include:

• Invite a friend or family member to worship

- Join a prayer or study group or a ministry of the church
- Serve at events
- Work with Rev. Kathy on a personalized Faith Growth Pathway
- Provide leadership by serving on a committee or team.

How Central Has Practiced Discipleship

As a church we also strive to practice intentional discipleship. Some highlights include:

Reception for Bishop David Bard

Central was chosen by the Conference to host a service and reception to welcome our new bishop, David Bard. Worship was inspiring, and food and fellowship afterwards were wonderful. Jannette Deszell handmade the Bishop a personalized stole featuring icons of Michigan, which he wore at the Michigan Area Annual Conference in June. Many hands made work light for the success and to the delight of all.

New and Revised Worship Schedule

The Conversation, our new contemporary service, was launched November 13th. The hallway outside Fellowship Hall has been spruced up to include a sitting area, chalk boards with inspirational Bible verses, and a prayer board.
