## ear Friends in Christ,

The first session of our *Defying Gravity* Stewardship Book Study involved an exercise in thinking about an activity or hobby participants enjoy that involves the use of at least one object. Ideas ranged from playing racquetball to sewing to just chatting with friends over a cup of coffee. After the activities and hobbies were shared, participants were asked to consider the challenges one would face if the activities and hobbies were attempted in zero gravity. Impossible, right?

Gravity is a fact of life. The relationship between objects in outer space—planets, stars, meteorites, etc.—is determined by gravity. Gravity on our planet earth determines the reality of our daily lives. If we drop an object, it will fall to the floor or ground. Sir Isaac Newton was best known for his law of gravitation that set the stage for the scientific revolution of the 17th Century. Gravity is an invisible force. Simply put, Gravity is the pull of objects on other objects.

In his book, *Defying Gravity*, Pastor Tom Berlin introduces the idea of "financial gravity." He writes, "I suggest that just as gravity exists in the natural world, financial gravity exists in the economic world where you and I live each day. Like the gravity of our planet, financial gravity enables us to function in our daily lives. It is the invisible force that compels us to pursue our basic necessities—things such as food, shelter, and clothing for ourselves and those we love." (Page 13)

So after reading that brief passage from Berlin's book, is financial gravity "good" or "bad?" Neither! Like the law of gravity, financial gravity simply exists! There is often a verse of scripture that is misquoted—"Money is the root of all evil." The actual quote, from I Timothy 6:10 is "For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, and in their eagerness to be rich some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pains." Money is neutral in terms of intrinsic value as evil or good. The love of money can be the root of

all kinds of evil, but while extreme evil has been perpetrated through the use of money, much good has also resulted from the use of money.

It's all about relationships. Just as gravity determines the relationship between heavenly bodies, financial gravity determines our relationship to that which we love and that on which we spend our money. I have a couple of questions with which I want to challenge you as we enter our Defying Gravity Stewardship Campaign. "What do vou love?" Of course we love our families and friends, and we have to provide for our basic needs. I often hear how much people love their church. The second question I want to ask is, "How does financial gravity affect your love for Central Church?" I invite you to prayerfully consider these question as we plan to support our wonderful ministries in the upcoming year. Bless you as you do so!

I look forward to seeing you in worship.
