Pear Friends in Christ,

Over the years during this time you will often see reminders about the deeper meaning of Christmas. You'll see billboards with "Keep Christ in CHRISTmas" written on them. An oldie but goodie is "Jesus is the Reason for the Season." (I have that one on a coffee mug that I use during this time of year.) Perhaps you've seen some of these reminders already this year. I'm not maligning these annual prompts to seek a connection with the child born in Bethlehem. In fact there are times when I can use a reminder of the real reason for all the hustle and bustle that will occur over the next few weeks.

Deepening our connection with Christ and our loving Creator is always a good thing. I commend spiritual practices and disciplines toward the purpose of growing our faith and being healthy – not only spiritually but physically and mentally. Besides our daily prayers and devotions, weekly worship and time spent in fellowship with others serve

to strengthen our relationships with our loving Creator and each other. There is also much to be gained by an extended period of time spent in prayer and meditation, as well as continuing education. Reading and learning from others feeds your soul and helps to focus your ministry.

An email notice went out a few weeks ago informing our congregation that Rev. Kathy Pittenger has been granted six weeks leave January 2nd – February 11th for formational and spiritual growth. A formational and spiritual growth leave is provided for in our United Methodist Denomination.

During this, Rev. Kathy will complete two on-line courses from Vibrant Faith University that she has been working on for some time, and as much of a third class as possible (which begins in January). As part of that coursework, Kathy will be working on our Faith Growth Pathway with ideas around experiential faith formation, digital enabled ministry, mission-related elements, and intergenerational

experiences.

Kathy and I have been working out the details of insuring that her ministries within our church continue during her absence. I fully support—and invite you to support—her efforts to continue her work at Vibrant Faith University as she seeks spiritual renewal. I take continuing education very seriously and applaud efforts to expand one's understanding of ministry and the development of skills for ministry.

In fact, I want to challenge you to seek your own methods of spiritual growth and renewal as our church supports Rev. Kathy's efforts towards that end. Use these days when it's best to be inside where it's warm to work on your inner life; through reading scripture, prayer and meditation and reading the works of those who have traveled pathways of spiritual growth. Be reminded of the "Reason for the Season" of Christmas, and embrace that reason each and every day.
