UMCOR Early Responder Ministry

The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is in the process of building up its Early Preparedness/ Disaster Response ministry. The plan calls for each District to have not only a District Coordinator, but also a District EP/DR Team, as well as a main contact at each local church.

The first activities identified in carrying out UMCOR's plans, are:

1. Recruit individuals to serve on the Crossroads District EP/DR Team;
2. Get individuals to become ERT trained; and
3. Identify individuals within each local church to be their local church EP/DR Points of Contact (POCs).

Central UMC will be participating in this important ministry. We will be hosting an Early Response Team training session on Saturday, January 20th 2018. The cost of the training is \$35 per person, which covers your training manual, t-shirt, badge, lunch and snacks.

About ERT Training

An ERT training event is an 8-hour day of learning the history, mission and purpose of being a part of an Early Response Team. During this time you

will learn about working with victims of natural disasters, how to help them in this time, what to do as volunteers, and what not to do. You will get a basic idea about site safety and the seven roles that are needed for each team. Upon completion of the course you will receive a t-shirt, and a badge saying that you have been trained as an Early Responder.

Welcoming Voices: Standing With Refugees

In an email sent October 12th, Bishop Bruce R. Ough, President of the Council of Bishops, put out a call to the United Methodist Church to recognize the plight of the more than 65 million men, women and children forced to leave their homes and migrate to places unknown. This Sunday you can learn more at an educational event designed to raise awareness and support for Waterford's Syrian refugee families.

The event, hosted by the Waterford Refugee Welcome Alliance, is a forum and reception to educate the local community on the refugee resettlement process, dispel misconceptions about refugees, and present ways in which members of the community can be supportive of refugees already resettled in the area. The event will feature a panel of welcoming voices from the civic and religious community, as well as voices from resettled refugees.

Informational material and refreshments will be available to attendees. The event is open to the public and will include a children's activity area. For more information, visit the Central Church website at

Dear Friends in Christ,

This fall Rev. Kathy and I re-imagined the youth programs of the church. Within Central's youth programs there are two groups—Youth Group for grades 6–12 and Tween Group for grades 4–6—who study and fellowship together and as individual groups. Together we have around 12 kids who participate on a regular basis.

The Youth Group is led by me and meets on Sunday evenings. Youth meetings begin with “happies and crappies”—what many of us know as “concerns and celebrations”—followed by prayer. During our programming time, the Youth Group is currently using a youth curriculum called “Spice Rack,” studying Paul's letter to the Philippians. After this time of Christian learning or working on projects, we wrap up our time with a game and a final prayer.

The Tween group, led by Rev. Kathy, also meets on Sunday evening and follows a similar format. The Tween Group is using the “Spark House Connect” curriculum as a basis for their time of fun, prayer and growth.

Already this fall our youth have had opportunities to have fun and serve others. Youth participation in this year's CROP Walk resulted in a record number of walkers and helped Central exceed our fund-raising goal for this annual event.

Last weekend, seventeen youth participated in this year's Trunk or Treat, building and staffing our famous “haunted tunnel.” The Saturday night prior to Trunk or Treat we spent the evening together for an overnight lock in to create the tunnel, decorate the sanctuary and watch a movie together.

Our next Youth Group event will be an overnight at Connection17, a Michigan

Area United Methodist Youth Event on November 10th – 11th in Mt. Pleasant. The weekend will feature awesome worship, inspiring speakers, fun and meaningful workshops, good food and great fellowship. The event is open to 6th–12th graders, and we currently have four students registered, leaving room for two more to attend. If you're interested in registering, contact me or Rev. Kathy.

I'm excited about the opportunities for Central's youth to grow in their faith and have the opportunity to grow closer to God. There's room for both more youth and adult volunteers. The Youth and Tween Groups meet most Sundays of the month at 5:45pm. If you'd like, join us for this wonderful time of fun, faith and fellowship.
