Church Ministry Thriving Under New Leadership

This year brought many changes to Central's Little Sprouts Preschool, including new leadership, expanded hours and a new child-centered learning methodology. Little Sprouts is unique in that it offers many benefits that aren't available in other preschool and day care programs, including:

- A child-centered approach to learning and care that is welcoming and considers the specific needs of individuals.
 - Extended hours and flexibility to accommodate the area's working families.

• Chapel time—similar to Central's Children's Time—in which concepts of love and the grace of God are reinforced.

This fall saw enrollment of 24 children in the program, with families coming from Waterford, Pontiac and White Lake.

There was much fun this year as our Little Sprouts learned about God and the world. A typical day includes morning message, small group, work time, large group, snack time, and time to play outside. During the fall the Sprouts took a trip to Spicer's apple orchard, where the kids went on a wagon ride, picked an apple and pumpkin, and enjoyed cider and donuts.

D^{ear Friends in Christ,}

An important part of the church is outreach; reaching out to others with the love and grace of God found in the life and teachings of Jesus Christ. Part of Jesus' last words as recorded in the Gospel of Matthew were, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations." (Matthew 28:19) While the entire quote is longer (Verses 18-20) there are two crucial concepts contained in verse 19.

First, go! We do very little good sitting in our church building waiting for visitors to come and check us out. We are called to go out into the world with the transforming Word of God. The church is at its best when we are out in the world meeting people in the places and times of their greatest needs. The second concept contained in verse 19 is that of making disciples; sharing the love and grace of God and inspiring others toward loving, grace-filled acts. The second concept of making disciples is the more complex, and takes some training for people to truly be skilled at encouraging others toward discipleship. The first concept is easy – GO!

So the week before Christmas a group from our church went to a couple establishments – Parker's Hilltop Restaurant and Brewery in Clarkston and the Rustic Leaf Brewing Co. on Highland Road in Waterford. Our purpose was just to be a presence in gathering places that would be busy as people began the festivities of Christmas. What fun! What an eye opener! What a great way to be God's people in a place where we usually wouldn't be, for the purpose of telling others about our church and sharing the gift of singing Christmas Carols with those present.

I played piano Friday night at the Rustic Leaf with Robin Danek, our Communications and Community Relations Staff member, who played guitar. There was a party with several children who joined us in singing Up on the Housetop, Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer and Jingle Bells. Then we would sing some sacred songs. One little girl, Mariah, sang every song with us that she knew; she particularly liked Do You Hear What I Hear. At one point in the evening, Robin said, "We're going to slow it down a bit and sing O Little Town of Bethlehem. Mariah asked, "What's that?" I shared with her that Bethlehem was the town where Jesus was born. Mariah ended up singing it right along with us!

I can't think of an easier or more natural way to proclaim the good news that God loves us so much He sent Jesus to tell us about that love, and how we should love others. It is my prayer in the New Year of 2018 that we gain the skills to make more disciples through our church – but first we must be willing to go! To go to the place where people are gathered and we can speak to them about our faith – through music or any way we're gifted to do so! I look forward to seeing you in church!
