

Thank you! Thank you for your support and extending so much grace during my time of formation and spiritual growth leave. My time away was restful, productive, and incredibly fulfilling. The main focal points of my leave were to accomplish the following: complete the two on-line courses that I had fallen behind in and begin the last course; daily time with God in scripture, prayer, and journaling; exercise at least 4 days a week; worship in different churches with my family; rest and spend time with my family.

First, I completed course five about Missional Faith Formation. Our discussions were very similar to some of the creative ministries that our church did around Christmas, and ideas about extending outreach into the community. Next, I completed course four about Life Cycle Faith Formation, which I focused on children and family ministries. As part of this course I

relevant for modern leadership.

I also had the opportunity (thanks to my amazing husband, Rich, and several great friends: Terese, Shannon, Rachel & Sue, Bud and Pastor Jack who cared for the kids) to travel to Kentucky and Ohio. In KY I stayed with good friends from Seminary and took a few days to rest, visit friends, and read. My plans had to change because of weather and the flu, so I headed north to the Canton, Ohio region where I

attended Malone University. I met with my favorite professor from college and had the incredible opportunity to sit in on three of his classes. I was blessed to be a student—even for few hours—and soak in the learning! His current students thought I was crazy!!

Each Sunday my family worshiped together with a different congregation. I enjoyed this experience immensely, and so did my family. My kids asked when we got to come back to Central many times though, so we did miss you all!

Through my time of leave I discovered God in new ways. I renewed my love of reading and even chose to turn off the TV and music so I could immerse myself in a book. I exercised and energized my body, mind, and spirit. I thank you for honoring my time away. I thank you for your graciousness to my family.
