# D<sup>ear Friends,</sup>

I wrote in the last issue of our *Chimes* newsletter that Rev. Kathy, Rainy Stephenson and I were headed to Baltimore for a conference with 23 other churches. The purpose of the conference was to begin the journey of "Creating a Culture of Calling" in our churches. We met people from all over the United States. It was invigorating to meet people interested in creating an atmosphere that inspires people toward meaningful ministry, and in connection with other followers of Jesus Christ!

It was a quick trip; we left on Wednesday morning and returned Friday evening. We spent Wednesday afternoon and evening listening to, and interacting with, Dr. Kathleen A. Cahalan, professor of practical theology at Saint John's School of Theology and Seminary in Minnesota. The study of calling and Christian vocation is Dr. Cahalan's area of interest and expertise. "Christian vocation," she says, "is about connecting our stories with God's story." In her most recent book, *The Stories We Live*, Cahalan rejuvenates and transforms vocation from a static concept to a living, dynamic reality. While we were in session with Dr. Cahalan, she mentioned—along with other instructors—that for the purposes of our program and project we are moving away from the language of vocation to the language of calling.

Calling is a much more dynamic word than vocation and frankly, I'm not sure we use the word "vocation" in our common, everyday language. While there is a current debate of calling vs. vocation in terms of a strong feeling of suitability for a particular career or job, calling offers the possibility of meaningful conversation. The subtitle of Cahalan's books is Finding God's Calling All Around Us. The idea is that we discover our greatest purpose by telling the stories of our lives and how we interact with God and others. Throughout our conference we referred to The Stories We Live as "the preposition book." There are eight prepositions that will help anyone interested in

discovering God's call for their lives: We are called **by** God, **to** follow, **as** we are, **from** grief, **for** service, **in** suffering, **through** others, **within** God.

Most likely, at least one or two of those prepositions resonates with your experience of God's calling upon your life. Perhaps you feel called directly by God or through a trusted friend and fellow Christian. Maybe you are attracted to service in a particular ministry. These eight short words are meant to begin the conversation within our congregation as we begin the journey of "Creating a Culture of Calling."

Please pray for our church and leadership as we assemble our team of people who will lead this effort in creating opportunities for all of us to become engaged in meaningful and purposeful ministry and lives! I look forward to seeing you in church.
