I recently had a conversation with one of our members and it was mentioned that our Staff-Parish Relations
Committee and I have not shared a great deal of what is being done to hire someone to take over the ministry that Rev. Kathy has been responsible for over the past 12 years. Others have asked questions and I apologize for not keeping our church family up to date.

After much consideration of our present need and the availability of qualified candidates, it has been decided that we are looking for a person to fill the position of Director of Lifelong Faith Formation. While it would definitely be a blessing to have an Ordained Deacon (like Rev. Kathy) we have titled the position as "Director" to leave open the possibility of a qualified lay person to fill that position. The position has been posted on two separate Deacon websites (state and nationwide) as well as at 14 United Methodist or United Methodist-related seminaries.

Please keep our SPRC in your prayers as we move forward in making this hire. We are also planning a joyful and fun Sunday (June 17) on which we will celebrate Rev. Kathy's ministry and say farewell.

The Memorial Garden

A Tranquil and Serene Place

At the main entrance to the church is a Memorial Garden. In 1995 the garden was established as a place for interment of ashes following cremation. The Memorial Garden Committee maintains a permanent record book of the deceased. Following placement, a bronze plaque is placed on the wall with the name and birth and death vears. Pre-placement fees are accepted and encouraged. The fee includes placement, bronze nameplate and garden maintenance. Placement fees are: Central members: \$425, nonmembers: \$625, children from infancy to one year: \$150 (to cover the cost of the nameplate.)

Information and placement/agreement forms are available in the church office or at the church web site. The Memorial Garden Committee will be planting flowers just before Memorial Day and each month during the summer we meet for weeding and trimming. We'd love to have your help. Pear Friends,

Over the last seven months, eight eighth graders—Ashley Gibbs, Aubrey Gibbs, Jason Hinsberg, Ashlynne Kuhn, Richard Kuhn III, Alexis Miller, Matthew Sullivan, and Anna Tompkins—have been working with mentors and myself to learn about the Christian faith, put their faith in practice, and experience God's love and grace. We watched goofy videos, engaged in deep conversation, worshiped with our Jewish brothers and sisters at Temple Israel (and met with one of the incredible Rabbis there), read Scripture, and built community together.

Confirmation is a rite of passage, a milestone event in the life of our church. But it is not a graduation. It is not the completion of learning about the church or faith or God. It is a process to help our students (and hopefully families and mentors) to learn about and grow deeper in their own faith and in community. Confirmation was a formative experience in my life. My small confirmation class visited a Jewish Synagogue, a Hispanic innercity Church, a Catholic Church, and a variety of other faith communities. We sat in the Pastor's Study and learned about our names, our faith, theological concepts and faith stories. We met with our mentors. The moments that I remember are less about "learning" and more about "community."

On Sunday, May 13th, our Confirmation students will stand up and profess their faith openly, and have the opportunity to continue their faith journey by becoming members of Central United Methodist Church. We, as a congregation, have the opportunity to remember our own vows of baptism and membership, and vow to walk with our students and newest members on their faith journey. We are one community. Our youth have so much insight, depth, story, and joy to share with us. Take a moment to listen to

their voices, their stories, and their insight.

I have been blessed eight-fold by this Confirmation Class. They have reminded me to have fun, to laugh, to be silly and to be in the moment. I have been inspired by the community they have formed regardless of which school they go to or which town they live in. I am proud of the work and commitment of this Confirmation Class and cannot wait to participate in their Confirmation Day.
