Central's ERTs in Action

On Saturday January 8th, 2018 several Central volunteers participated in UMCOR ERT (Early Response Team) training taught by Bob McCormick, the Michigan Conference's Early Response Team Coordinator. We learned when responding to floods or disasters we may need to tarp damaged roofs and/ or clean and disinfect flooded homes. We learned about safety, and probably most importantly, about responding compassionately to those who have experienced a disaster. The importance of listening to disaster victims' stories was stressed throughout the training. Shortly after the Father's Day flooding in Houghton County, Bob notified local volunteers that he and his wife Lisa would be taking a trailer with flood buckets to the Houghton area, and that a volunteer response center was opened and operational. Last minute, Jim and I decided to respond to the call for help. We traveled to Houghton Friday night, made our way to the volunteer response center on Saturday morning, did a short safety session, picked up sunscreen, gloves and respiratory masks, and then anxiously headed out to our assignment. We were a little worried about having the stamina to do the physical labor that was most likely needed.

We volunteered in a quaint beach town called Hubbell. There was large machinery clearing and restoring roads and sewer lines on the street we were assigned to. Others in the town were preparing food to take to the fire station that served as a meeting place. We and many others (up to 50 people) worked at a home where the flooding had filled the basement with six feet of sand and mud.

During the weekend most of the sand and mud was removed from the basement by hand using shovels and buckets. This is called a "bucket brigade." The homeowner still needed to have the basement cleaned, disinfected, and dried out before she could have her utilities restored. Jennifer (the home owner) was so grateful for the large number of volunteers (most she did not know) who helped out. Please keep Jennifer and other UP families affected by the flooding in your prayers.

It was a beautiful weekend where many people came together to help those needing a helping hand. It is such a simple idea!! Jim and I feel blessed to have been a part of it!


- Summer reading book return table up to four volunteers
