As I write this letter, a little over a week since I've returned from camp, the remnants of mosquito—and I have no doubt other bug bites—are still present on my arms and legs. But as I reflect on my week communing with nature and

other Christians both young and old—I realize that serving as a Camp Dean and Counselor each summer is a joy that I look forward to each year. Church Camp is a formative experience which many pastors share when they come

before the Board of Ordained Ministry, on which I have served over the past eight years. Many ministry candidates have wonderful memories of camp that present a great picture of our faith community and the wonders of our Creator God.

I have seven reasons why I support the camping ministry of our Michigan Area of the United Methodist Church: First, it gives us the opportunity to unplug. In a recent message I shared the importance of unplugging from electronic devices that can take over our workdays and even intrude upon our time off from our daily toils. Second, camping allows us to commune with nature; to wonder at the beauty of a flower or tree, to listen to the waves of the lake, the whoooo of an owl or the mournful cry of a loon. Third, camping allows for an intergenerational experience of community, and to witness leadership of counselors, deans and camp staff. Camp is a microcosm of the

church, making clear the importance of relationships.

A fourth reason I support camp is the worship. Digging into scripture stories, singing joyful—sometime silly—songs, and praying with one another allows for children and youth to learn to worship God in God's beautiful nature.

A fifth reason I love camp is the food. It would not be a week of camp if not for French toast and bacon on buddy burners! (There is not enough space to explain buddy burners but feel free

to ask me.) Sixth is the play—and I would say holy play—that allows for campers to relax, be playful and enjoy building relationships during this special week in the life of young people. The seventh reason I support camp is the life-long relationships that are formed. This past Annual Conference, I had a young woman come up to me and share her experience of the camp I led and the memories she cherished. My own children still stay in contact with fellow campers from over ten years ago.

Thank you, Central Church family for supporting our denominational camp programs! You have planted and cultivated a harvest that knows no end! I want you to know you are a blessing as we continue to enjoy these summer days. I look forward to seeing you in worship.

Ministry Highlight: Tribe of Daniel

Tribe of Daniel is the ministry that decorates the church for worship and special events. The goal of this ministry is to enhance the worship experience through progressive theatrical staging that illustrates key elements of a sermon series or liturgical season (Lent, Advent, etc.), with the goal of increasing understanding and memorability. If you've noticed the props, artwork and lighting decorating the Sanctuary and/or Chapel, you're seeing Tribe of Daniel at work! They're also responsible for the large candles out by M-59 that light the night during Advent.

Tribe of Daniel is led by Myke Robson and includes Jeannette Deszell, Margaret Hazlett, Carol Kozel, Sue Krueger, Tamara Luesse, Betty Pfeiffer, Rainy Stephenson, Hannah Strobel and other volunteers throughout the years.

The ministry started out when Sara Hazen was responsible for worship arts for the UM Conference. Myke assisted Sara and realized the power that visual arts can have as part of the worship experience. Myke has always had a love of creativity, and felt called to bring this ministry to Central's worship services. He felt God calling as he began to notice creative installations, which would then get him thinking about ideas for enhancing worship. He decided to contact a few Central members to gauge interest, and found that other members loved the idea. They joined in and Tribe of Daniel was born.

Myke's greatest joy is when people notice the staging and artwork and comment on it, and conversation begins. He knows then that it has made a difference in that person's experience and understanding.

One recent installation that Myke feels was particularly successful was "The Dark Wood," which supported Central's 2018 Lenten study and message series. The Sanctuary began as an ominous, even "scary" place, then "bloomed" throughout Lent with flowers, birds and wildlife, culminating in Easter lilies and the cross. Other impactful projects were "Weavings of Faith," a tapestry woven throughout Lent and into Easter, and "Resurrection Jesus," which was a building up of a "stained glass" cross during Lent that revealed the risen Christ on Easter.

Myke's vision for the future of Tribe of Daniel includes the use of more audio/ video elements as well as more individuals to help with envisioning and executing

designs. There is creative power in groups, and Tribe of Daniel welcomes anyone who has a love for the visual arts to join in this Ministry. Myke stresses that you don't need experience in design or staging, just a love of creativity and a desire to help enhance the worship experience for others.
