ear Friends,

We've had a busy beginning to our fall schedule. While we still have a quarter of the year left, we are already making plans for next year, building on what we've begun this past month.

October has traditionally been the time of year when we consider our support of next year's ministry. Our Stewardship Campaign theme this year is Earn. Save. Give. Those concepts come from John Wesley's classic sermon, The Use of Money. In that message Wesley defined some basic practices regarding money and wealth. Wesley believed that there is nothing wrong with having wealth, and in fact we should earn and save as much as we can. Having met our personal needs through that practice, we then respond to God's call to give toward God's Kingdom work in the world. I encourage you to take time to learn more about the mission and ministry of Central Church so that you may prayerfully decide how you want to support our presence in the world throughout the next year.

In October we are also preparing for another program—Creating a Culture of Call (or C3 for short)—that will be in full development in January and February of next year. In October, during our Stewardship Campaign, we will be viewing a video introducing us to the concept of Creating a Culture of Call. I will begin an eight-week message series in November exploring what it means to be called by God to be in relationship to one another and to God. Then, in January and February we will have small group

studies utilizing the book, The Stories We Live: Finding God's Calling All around Us, by Kathleen Cahalan.

C3 is a three-year process of developing a deeper understanding of how God calls us all to be who we are created to be in the world. Yes, that means the ministry and mission of the church, but there is a more basic call of God upon all our lives—to be in relationship with one another and with God; as parents, teachers, spouses, siblings, brothers and sisters in Christ. Our relationships and the lives we live are an indication of the direction and purpose God intends for each of our lives.

As we commit to funding our ministry for next year, I want us to seriously take up the task of preparing to engage in a study of God's call upon all our lives. When we discover our deepest purpose in life, we are truly blessed by the community in which we live out our purpose. As we prepare for next year, I encourage you to ponder living a life worthy of God's call (Ephesians 4:1).

I look forward to seeing you in worship!

### Blessings in a Backpack

Thank you so much for giving my family food. It look into the pantry and there was food there and I that.

I think it's really amazing
that you're thinking so
much about the children in
this school to give them free
food every week.

These are just two of the notes from the 5th-graders that were received at the end of last year. The Blessings in a Backpack program in Waterford, co-chaired by Judge Rich Kuhn and Barb Laing, is now immersed in its eight year of providing weekend food for elementary school students who qualify for the free and reduced fee lunches during the week. Now in the fifth year at Riverside, the program is meeting new challenges of serving more children.

Blessings is attempting to add another school, Donelson Hills, to the program. To do that, the steering committee first needs to raise enough money to feed every eligible child for one year, or \$45,000! There is \$18,000 more to go, and then they can start feeding the 450 eligible children at Donelson Hills, in addition to our Riverside kids.

# How Can You Help?

So, even as the team wants to sincerely thank you for all your past and current support, they're asking you to help even more. It still takes only \$100 to feed a child for one year. Checks can be made out to Central United Methodist Church, with "Blessings in a Backpack" in the memo line. Donations are tax deductible.

You can volunteer at Riverside once a month to help unpack the truck that delivers food from Meijer, or come on Wednesdays to help pack

backpacks. More volunteers
will be needed when they open
at Donelson Hills. For more

# Is It Making a Difference?

Teachers tell Blessings personnel that kids return to school on Mondays more alert and ready to learn, and they hear from parents that the food helps their children. In the past seven years, they've provided over 159,600 meals. More than 185 volunteers—many from Central—gave approximately 7000 hours.

So, it's about the kids, and it isn't. It's also about us. Will we sit quietly by and bemoan the fact that children in our community are hungry? Or will we continue to answer Christ's call to compassion as part of our own spiritual journey? This is still a justice issue, but until systemic change happens, and all are fed, we must feed these children.

Thank you for what you've already done. Please continue to give money, give time or offer prayers for this project, or for any project that allows us to be the face of Jesus in a hurting world.

When have we given enough? When everyone has enough.
