

Happy Holidays Central Church,

One of my favorite seasons to celebrate is the Olympics. Can that be considered a season? I love watching athletes compete on my television screen. I'm amazed by their determination, joy, passion, and stories. Each athlete develops a routine to prepare for their big moment. Sometimes the actual race they compete in can take seconds, but the preparation takes time and planning. Most Olympians don't spend the moments leading up to their event trying to learn a new trick, lifting weights, or buying a new outfit. Instead, they spend time preparing mentally for what is ahead. They spend time with their coach, they envision their routine, they play their favorite music play list, and they stretch. Each of these activities helps prepare them mentally for the big day ahead while they wait for their big moment.

This preparation is for Olympians what Advent is for Christians. Advent is a season to prepare, to wait, and to anticipate the joy of Jesus' birth. Too often we fill the month of December with the busy-ness of buying new clothes, running around for the perfect gift, hosting a flawless party, or packing our schedule with social events. When we do this we get to Christmas exhausted, stressed, in debt, and unfocused. Perhaps, we can take a cue from the Olympians—making Advent about relaxing, stretching, spending time with mentors and friends, and envisioning our world filled with the love of the Christ child.

At the Advent Lunch and Learn event on December 2nd from noon-2 pm I hope to help us adopt this mindset of preparation. We will spend the first hour in fellowship over a simple meal; then we will share a short time to worship together. During the second hour, various stations will help you engage in stress-relieving, thought engaging, advent practices. Stations will be activities that you can take home or replicate at home so that you might continue to practice them throughout the season of Advent. People of all ages are encouraged to join us and there is no cost to attend. If you plan to join us on December 2nd, please sign up outside the office, call, or email so the appropriate amount of food and activities will be available.

Thankfully Advent is not a competition, but we do have much to gain when we make space in our lives to receive the peace and promise of the Christ child.

Ministry Spotlight: Oakland Hope

Motivated by the love of God to alleviate hunger and empower lives.

Oakland Hope has been designated as a recipient of a portion of Central's Christmas offering. Oakland Hope is a food pantry serving residents of Oakland County that is funded by a selfrun thrift store. The thrift store is the main funding mechanism for the food pantry, which provides supplementary food in a "client choice" format.

Food insecurity is a real a growing problem in Oakland County. The organization takes donations of items, merchandises them in its store, then uses the proceeds to purchase food. They also secure food donations via partnerships with Forgotten Harvest and Gleaner's Food Bank. While emergency help is available, the program is designed more

as a supplement to help families through financial shortages, when a decision may have to be made between buying food and paying a bill, repairing a vehicle, etc. Because the pantry is more like a grocery store, allowing clients to select items, there is less food waste and it is more conducive to families that may have food allergies.

Central has a history of supporting Oakland Hope; in 2018 a portion of the proceeds from Central's rummage sale was donated to the organization to support their mission. Central is also evaluating opportunities for hands-on mission with Oakland Hope in 2019.
