ear Friends,

There are times you just can't do it all. I felt that way while leading worship on February 24 when I shared openly with the congregation that it had been a tough week. Our church family lost a beloved member of our church, whose life we celebrated on Friday, February 22. We lifted up Wes Tindall's life—sharing stories that brought laughter and smiles to many—while acknowledging our loss. Thursday, I learned that a camp to which I had volunteered a week of my life for over thirty years was closing—the end of an era for our entire family. I learned on Friday that the wife of a colleague I once mentored passed away earlier in the month, and on Saturday I learned that my former brother-in-law had committed suicide.

I shared with worship attenders that it was a "crappy week!" I rhetorically asked, "Can your pastor share that with you?" and people nodded and, I believe, appreciated my honesty. My comment about not being able to do it all relates to the other side of having a "crappy week." I am still standing firm in my faith, and I live with the knowledge that we are not alone in our grief and disappointments; God is with us and we have each other for support. Yes, it was a challenging

week but, as Psalm 23 professes, God's presence and comfort is with

As we once again approach Lent, with Ash Wednesday on March 6, I am well aware that many look at this time in our Christian calendar as a "bummer"; a solemn time in which we give something up and there are all sorts of extra expectations put upon us in the church—extra services, extra small groups to participate in and extra service projects to support. I suggest that we look at the other side of this concept of Lent, and consider it to be an opportunity to grow in our faith, to be aware of God's presence and deepen our appreciation for each other as we journey together through this holy time of year.

I respectfully and prayerfully ask you to consider what it would mean to focus on deepening your faith during this Season of Lent. Let's travel together, thankful for each other and the relationships that God desires with us. I look forward to seeing you in worship.

A Roof for St. Mark's UMC in Liberia

St. Mark United Methodist Church in Kakata, Liberia and Waterford Central UMC began a partnership in ministry in 2013. The two congregations pledged to exchange people, information, and prayer. A key ministry project was to rebuild St. Mark's church, which was destroyed in the civil war. The congregation of St. Mark UMC has been worshiping in a high school for more than 15 years as their new church has been slowly rising from the ruins.

Central has kept its pledge to reconstruct the church; since we created the partnership with St. Mark UMC we have sent \$24,760 for reconstruction of their church building. When we started the church was little more than an outline on the ground and a hand-painted idea of what the new church building would look like. Today, thanks to your generosity, the walls are up to the roof line, and ready for the galvanized corrugated metal roof.

Our new goal is to secure \$18,000 in funding for the roof. To achieve this, Central has developed a CrowdRise page that we are asking members to share with friends and family via social media, word of mouth, email, Christmas cards or whatever means work for you! Use the URL www.crowdrise.com/liberiaroof to share it. Or, simply click "share" it from Central's Facebook page or group. A few pointers for sharing on Facebook:

- "Tag" friends and family that you think would be likely to support this effort. That ensures they will see it.
- Share more than once; not everyone will see your post the first (or second or third) time. Sharing one a week is a good recommendation for this type of "social fund raising."

If you would like to donate to this initiative, please do so via the CrowdRise page, the Sunday offering plate or online at Central's website or mobile giving site. If donating outside of CrowdRise, just mark your donation "Roof for St. Mark's," or designate "Liberia - St. Mark's Roof" in online or mobile giving.

Thank you for your support of this mission to get the congregation of St. Mark's into their new church home. A special thank you to everyone who attended and helped host the potluck on February 17th. \$2,443 was raised in support of this ministry. What a great start!


