

ear Resurrection People!

I want to address you as Resurrection People first, because Easter is April 21, when we celebrate the anniversary of Jesus' resurrection. The second reason I address you as Resurrection People is because I truly believe that God calls us to live a "Resurrection Lifestyle," not just believe in the resurrection of Jesus Christ!

What do I mean by a "Resurrection Lifestyle?" I mean a lifestyle that is marked by the belief that all things are possible because of Jesus' resurrection. (See Matthew 19:26 and Mark 10:27) When Jesus made this proclamation, he was in a conversation with his disciples concerning salvation and eternal life. But Jesus' words are not confined to the great hereafter. His words are for each day that we are alive—it's about lifestyle; living our lives in response to Christ's resurrection.

For nearly 35 years in ministry, I have seen great things happen among Christ's Resurrection People! I've witnessed people healed, marriages mended and families reconciled. Those are resurrection events!

Even when people are not healed and marriages are not mended; even when families are not reconciled I have seen resurrection faith work in those instances as well. People have moved on in their lives after difficulty, and experienced wholeness and peace after devastating events. Again, evidence of resurrection living!

A Resurrection Lifestyle is based on the belief that God loves and cares for us and that "for God all things are possible" (Mark 10:27) It is also predicated on the

belief that "I can do all things through him who strengthens me." (Philippians 4:13) It is because God resurrected Jesus from the grave that we live in the confidence of God's promise of loving care and provision, as well as receiving life that is abundant and eternal!

We have spent this Season of Lent focused on how to listen to God.
We've talked about the places that we find meaning—the caves of our lives where we seem to connect with God best. We've talked about our bodies and breathing and how our bodies are receptors of God's direction, we've considered the importance of scripture that informs our faith and considered the power of prayer and healing that leads us to wholeness and salvation. We've also talked about how each of us encounters God as individuals, finding the mystic within ourselves.

All this listening leads us to finding our own voice. That is what we will focus on Easter morning. The challenge for the church, and for each of us, is to bear witness to our being Resurrection People! I want to specifically invite you to our Easter morning worship experience. We will talk about finding our voice so that others may know our Resurrection Lifestyle. See you in worship!



An Easter to Remember

Bring a Friend and Let's Celebrate!

Easter is a great time to bring a friend or family member to church to hear the good news of salvation. Most people attend church because they were invited. In fact, 76% of people attending a worship service for the first time are there because someone they know invited them.

This Easter, we invite *you* to invite a friend to church, and we have invitation cards to help make it easy. You can also use our Facebook event to quickly and easily invite friends and family to Easter service. There are three services on Easter—8am sunrise service, 9:15 The Conversation contemporary worship and

sunrise service, 9:15 The Conversation contemporary worship and 10:30am Sanctuary worship—as well as Easter breakfast from 9am – 11am.



Hospitality Is the Order of the Day

Easter is the number one day for church attendance. That means that we will have many guests to whom we can show hospitality. Be on the lookout on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday for new faces, and make sure to be welcoming and friendly. A few simple things you can do:

• Remember that they are Guests that we have prepared for, not unexpected visitors.

 Go out of your way to say "hi" to new people; the worse that will happen is that you'll greet someone who's been here before.

• If you see someone looking lost, help them find what they're looking for. Perhaps they need to find the nursery or the Sunday school. Or, maybe they're not sure where to sit...or where the restrooms are.

- Within five minutes before or after the service try to engage in conversation with someone new. Encourage them to visit the welcome table to pick up their free gift and more information on Central. Point out the coffee and refreshments station.
- Fill out the Connection Card—it's how we connect with new people as well as with you. Every few weeks this card changes, and there are always new volunteer opportunities that can help you grow in discipleship.

• Remember that many of our Guests may not have been to church since Christmas, or since last Easter. Or, maybe they haven't been to church since they were a child...or ever. Anything you can do to make them feel comfortable will go a long way.

But mostly, just be friendly and welcoming, and let's make this an Easter that they'll remember!


