

Dear Friends, Rabbi Shmuley Boteach, in his 2012 book, *Kosher Jesus* (Gefen Books, 2012), reflected on the term "Judeo-Christian." Boteach wrote:

GIf I can leave my readers with one

ringing message...it is this: The hyphen between Jewish and Christian values is Jesus himself. Both religions share him, looking to him from opposite sides of a chasm. He can bring us closer to one another, if only we are brave enough to allow for understanding him in a new light.

C At a time when the world flails in search of values, strangled by materialism, divisiveness, instability, doubt and unrest, we must return to the basic ideals we share in common. All of these are to be found in the life and lessons of Jesus of Nazareth, lover of Israel, rebel against Rome, Jewish hero, and the inspiration for innumerable acts of Christian charity." (Kindle location 88% - 2928 of 3319)

Wow! What a positive statement of looking at what connects us rather than that which divides us. I am returning today from our Michigan Area Annual Conference more hopeful than when I left Waterford a week ago. So many people went to Traverse City with a feeling of dread and fear of conflict.

I'm not saying that there wasn't conflict, but for the most part people behaved themselves, and the parts of Annual Conference that I enjoy most (Worship and Preaching, Fellowship with Colleagues and the feeling of being part of something bigger than I) were still inspirational and well-presented. In addition to what I like best about Conference, our own Rev. Cora Glass was ordained a Deacon and my son, Pastor Jeremiah Mannschreck, was ordained an Elder on Sunday, June 2.

Friends, there has been much conversation and concern about the future of the United Methodist Church. There will continue to be concerns for at least another year, in my opinion. I believe the 2020 General Conference of the UMC will offer a more concrete and hopeful plan for our denomination, and it will probably result in more than one denominational affiliation. The change in my heart and mind that calms my spirit and gives me hope is the thought that this is not the death of a denomination, but rather a birth.

That fact is, the church has experienced schisms for centuries; and the Methodist movement has had its share of those schisms. We split over the issue of slavery, we remained separate from other Methodist-based denominations to this day (Wesleyan Churches, African Methodist Episcopal Churches, the Nazarene Church).

Here's my thinking. If a Rabbi can see Jesus as a connecting point between Jews and Christians, we who proclaim to follow Jesus should be able to work toward a future in which the church of Christ continues—yes, through different paths and expressions—but continues none the less.

I encourage you to stand strong in your faith, pray for your church and trust that God is working for the good of all who love God. I look forward to seeing you in worship.
