

Dear Friends,

While the church—our church—finds itself in uncertain times in terms of inclusion issues concerning the LGBTQIA community, finances, and working with other Waterford churches to create a vital presence of the UMC in the area, I want to assure you that on a daily basis there is plenty for our church to do. It's a challenge to juggle all these concerns with day to day ministry, but initiatives are under way to make us more effective.

Last November, part of our staff attended the Reach Summit in Lansing. Those who participate in this summit were invited to participate in various network groups throughout the following year. Since January of this year, Rev. Cora has been in a group for youth ministry. Robin Danek, our Marketing and Community Relations Coordinator, and I signed up for the "ministry systems" group that has met monthly since January. The basis of this group is the work of Nelson Searcy, Pastor of The Journey, a large church in New York City. Prior to launching The Journey, Pastor Searcy was on the pastoral staff at Saddleback Church in California (Rick Warren, Lead Pastor).

Searcy identifies eight ministry systems that are critical to being fruitful in ministry: Assimilation System, Evangelism System, Worship Planning System, Ministry System, Small Group System, Strategic System, Stewardship System and Leadership System. Each of these systems is detailed in books by Searcy. Robin and I have been reading one of these books each month and participating in a meeting on the second Thursday of the month at a church that has implemented these systems. There are about a dozen churches participating with us in this group. Following lunch, the pastors in the group meet for an additional hour and a half to discuss another book related to the topic of Searcy's book for that month.

We began to implement Searcy's systems about two years ago. My upcoming preaching schedule has been greatly influenced by Searcy's work. The Connection Cards we've used since September are a part of the Assimilation System that encourages people to be in ministry that is meaningful, and to participate in groups that meet throughout the year. As the various systems are implemented, the Connection Card becomes the conduit for communication and participation in ministries and events.

We have also implemented much of the finance and stewardship system (called the Maximize System) in our church. The "Offering Stories" we share during worship are a key piece, as is our ability for people to give via mobile and text message. Our Stewardship Campaign in September will be heavily influenced by this system.

Searcy is fond of saying that the word "System" stands for "Saving You Stress, Time, Energy and Money." During this summer, my messages will be about several of these systems and how they will impact our ministry in the near future, and for years to come. I hope you will come to worship our God, who created all that is—systems you might say. The systems of God's creation should be reflected in the ministries of the church—our church. These systems will help us better manage all the concerns and ministries of the church that are for God's glory and our benefit. I look forward to seeing you in worship this summer!
