It has been a busy summer, as it certainly felt as if the pace didn't slow down for our church through the longer days of summer. We have been involved in many different projects and developed systems through which we will conduct our ministry with greater efficiency, as well as effectiveness. I've spent the summer months preaching on these systems developed by Rev. Dr. Nelson Searcy, Pastor of The Journey in New York City. As I've shared numerous times, Searcy writes that SYSTEM can be an acrostic that stands for Saves You Stress, Time, Energy and Money.

We certainly hope to experience less stress, save time, energy and money as we move forward into a busy fall. We will have our annual Rally Day on September 8, with a potluck lunch following one worship service that morning at 10:30 a.m. For a half hour before that service, The Band of Misfits, our contemporary worship team, will offer a time of praise music. Come and join in on this time of praise and singing. That performance will be the last performance by The Band of Misfits, as we will discontinue our bandled (contemporary) worship service called "The Conversation."

We are presently putting together a team of people who will study the demographics of the area surrounding our church, as well as our own Church's demographic. That study will help us discern who we should reach out to, and how we should shape our worship services to be bridges into the greater community. It is my hope that we will be better at reaching all people in our area as we learn the skills to reach out to a particular population. We will be

aided in this work by The Rev. Cathy Townley, a worship specialist, who visited with us late July. Cathy will be coaching me, our staff and Church in order to make the most of our efforts in the months to come. Given the necessary work that needs to be done, we may be able to create and launch a new worship experience in six to twelve months. (There are several opportune times to launch a new worship experience in a one-year cycle.)

In September we will conduct our Generosity Campaign as we seek to provide support for our ministry in the year 2020! A series of three messages will begin on Rally Day, and we will received Generosity Cards on September 22. This year's theme is based on the Wizard of Oz story, and we will have fun together as we look forward to the ministries we will be about in 2020.

I am asking you, Central Church family to do one thing—pray. Pray for the leadership of our church as we take bold action to move forward in the creation of a new worship service. Pray for me as your Pastor and pray for our church in general. Thank you in advance for those prayers! I look forward to seeing you in worship.

From the Music Director Creating Art



Sunday School Child Check-in

This fall Central Church will launch our new child check-in station. This station will enhance the hospitality and safety of our Sunday School program. The system will help us ensure children are picked up by a trusted caregiver after worship. Those bringing children to church on Sunday will be required to check-in their children and will receive two name tags per child. One name tag is for the child to wear so that we can greet them by name. We hope this name tag can also alert Sunday school volunteers to allergies and emergency contact information. The second name tag will be kept by the parent/guardian/ caregiver and act as verification to pick children up after service.

When children are released to Sunday School after the children's message, volunteers sometimes find it difficult to identify who brought which child to church. As a church community, we might currently feel familiar enough with our congregation that this doesn't feel like a pressing issue, but starting this process now with our members and weekly attendees will help communicate to guests and friends that their child's safety is a priority at Central Church. Look for our child check-in station at church this fall!
