

### UPCOMING IN WORSHIP (10:30am)

Heritage Sunday honoring our 50-year members. Pastor Jack continues his "Hope in the Darkness" message series with *Waiting for God*.

Pear Friends,

On October 22 I led a meeting open to all our members and friends. About twenty people gathered to hear about our *Building Worship Bridges* program. Rev. Cora was in attendance as well as our Music Director, Kevin Naeve and our Marketing and Community Relations staff member, Robin Danek. As many of you know, until this past September we had at least two worship services at Central Church. Currently we are worshiping at 10:30 on Sunday mornings. This single service is choir-led with more traditional music and liturgy.

A great deal of our meeting on the 22nd was devoted to the explanation of an instrument called MissionInsite, a data tool developed by a para-church organization using the latest census information to determine the religious preferences and habits of those living in the area we serve as a local congregation. It also reports basic demographic information such as age, family type, income and education. Robin Danek and Rev. Cora have been working diligently with MissionInsite to deepen our understanding of who lives in our area so we can discern how best to reach out to them through worship.

With that demographic and religious preference information at our fingertips, I shared a basic plan for our church through October of 2020. Later this month, and into December, we will be making some changes in our 10:30 worship service to provide a more meaningful experience for our members and friends as well as newcomers. That is

the first step in our Building Worship Bridges program.

The second step is examining information from MissionInsite and studying the book, *Building Worship Bridges* by Cathy Townley. Cathy is a worship specialist who has helped many churches develop inspirational worship services, meeting the needs of the congregational community as well as the extended community. Cathy will be teaching 6-7 sessions on Tuesday nights in January and February to a group of people that will be commissioned in December to lead our church in creating our second worship service.

In March we will offer a study on how to reach out into our community to engage our determined mission field—those who we hope to connect with through worship and other programming.

There is a lot going on, and I realize that much of our work is behind the scenes. It is my pledge to you, our church family, that we will communicate that work on a regular basis. In the meantime, I want to ask you to pray for our church. Pray that we will create engaging worship experiences that "build bridges" into our community; so that we will be prepared for those God is entrusting to our caring church family. Please make the pledge to pray at least five minutes a week for this program. It will make all the difference in the world for our efforts!

I look forward to seeing you in worship!

#### Spotlight on Ministry: Caring Core Angels

Every week we receive letters and notes thanking Central's Caring Core Angels for their compassionate cards, prayers and support of members and past members that are struggling with health issues, the loss of a loved one or other personal challenges.

The Caring Core Angels make personal home calls and send "we care about you cards" to those members (and/or family members) of Central UMC who are ill, recovering, or are homebound. They also send cards to members/former members who have moved away.

The Caring Core Angels are coordinated by Phyllis Liming, who says "I thank God for the privilege of serving Him at my advanced age as a member of the Caring Core, and for all those who give of their time energy and resources to communicate with members of our congregation."

Phyllis maintains three active lists—the Continuing Health Concerns Prayer List which has 86+ names, the Health Concerns Prayer List and a list of 22 members/former members who are living out of the area.

There are three "Angels" who make personal calls to people on the prayer list. With three persons making four home calls each month and nearly 70 members on the list, each member receives a home call about once every four months, with members who are new on the Prayer List given preference each month. These visitors also take Prayer Shawls to members who are recently listed as having surgery or illness to remind them that we care about them and are praying for them.

There are 20 "Angels" who send cards to the people on the prayer lists and the out-of-area list. The names are rotated alphabetically so that folks receive a card from a different Angel each month. When a member is having a birthday or wedding anniversary this is also acknowledged by the Caring Core Angels.

Phyllis distributes the lists for the upcoming month in the narthex or via email the last Sunday of each month. She typically also includes an inspirational message or devotion with the list.

#### Prayer Shawl Ministry

Phyllis and Barb Burns also crochet the Prayer Shawls that are delivered by the Angels to those on the prayer list. Recently, Barb has also embroidered flowers and other designs on fleece material for winter prayer shawls. Yarn and other materials have been donated by members of the congregation.
