

Dear Friends in Christ,

It has been an incredibly busy January! As I find myself still reveling in a wonderful and meaningful Advent and Christmas Season, our staff and leadership is beginning plans for our Lenten Season. I very much enjoyed sharing the Advent series of messages utilizing the imagery from *The Nutcracker*, and our Christmas Eve services were well attended. Our "Christmas Eve Eve," designed for young families, doubled in attendance from the previous year and Rev. Cora led an incredibly engaging worship experience!

But when the calendar turned from December 2019 to January 2020, I have to tell you I panicked! Our church jumped into 2020 with both feet on the ground. We are continuing our work with the *Creating a Culture of Calling* Program, as well as working with worship specialist Cathy Townley on creating a new service that will meet the needs of both members and friends, as well as the greater community we serve.

Members of our Building Worship Bridges Team have been meeting weekly with Rev. Townley, studying her book *Building Worship Bridges* – *Accelerating Neighborhood Connections through Worship*, watching videos, and making plans toward creating a new worship experience for our church. This dedicated team will conclude the "Learning Phase" on February 18, and then we will begin the "Launch Phase" of this effort.

This Launch Phase will begin with an effort to train our members and friends

in the art of inviting and welcoming guests to our church and ministry. Just as we have been working on creating a culture of calling, we will expand those efforts to becoming a missional church focused on the needs of our greater community, inviting and welcoming new people into our community of faith.

In an effort to keep our community informed about this process, we will have a Town Hall Meeting after worship on March 1st. All are welcomed to this meeting as we share some of the key concepts the Building Worship Bridges Team have learned, as well as the next steps for our congregation. There will also be a series of messages in the spring on why we need to create worship bridges and launch this new worship service at Central Church.

This effort will take time, energy and resources. While it will be necessary to dedicate some financial resources toward this effort, I do want to share with you that we have received a threeyear grant from the Methodist Union of Detroit. We will need to look at technology needs, hiring people and create appropriate space for this new service to thrive.

For now, please pray for this new effort. Please set aside just 5 minutes a week to lift up the efforts of our Building Worship Bridges Team and the future of this new worship experience. God bless you and God bless our church. I look forward to seeing you in worship.



New WOTA Transportation Service

Waterford now has bus service for seniors and disabled adults age 18+ who reside in Highland Township, Walled Lake, Waterford and White Lake. The West Oakland Transportation Authority (WOTA) is a door-to-door, on-demand transportation service operated in partnership with SMART through the Community Transit program. WOTA has 12 lift-equipped vehicles.

The service area includes approximately 290 square miles with the following boundaries:

NORTH - Northern Border of Highland & White Lake Townships, and Clarkston.

EAST - Orchard Lake Rd. between 12 & 16 Mile and Hiller Rd. to Telegraph between Pontiac Lake and Williams Lake Roads and into Pontiac for medical ONLY.

WEST - US 23 (Hartland) and Kensington Rd. and the west edge of Milford Township.

SOUTH - Grand River Ave. to 10 Mile & Haggerty.

Before using the service you must complete a Passenger Information Form and, if disabled, a professional care-giver (doctor, counselor, etc.) must complete the Professional Verification Form. Forms are available at the WOTA website at https://www. ridewota.org/rider-guidelines/. If you don't have Internet access, forms are available at the WOTA office or can be mailed to you. The process will generally take 2-4 days to be registered once all documents have been received.
