

Dear Central Family,

As I walked into Central Church for the first time as your newly appointed pastor, I remember our District Superintendent saying to me, "There's a bit of work needed on the building. You'll have to spruce things up a bit." As I moved in to both the parsonage as well as the church building, I discovered that there were already a number of projects planned and approved by our church leadership.

The handicap-accessible doors at both our north and south entrances and handicap-accessible bathrooms were done quite quickly, and our elevator/ lift was constructed within my first two years. We then had our first capital campaign during my time as your pastor and those funds, plus funds from the earnings on our endowment, allowed us to get new sound and lighting for our sanctuary. We have new signage allowing people to navigate our building better and television screens to share information about our many ministries we are a "screen society!"

Smaller projects included painting the office, which the staff did, installing new shades for the office complex, replacing old vertical blinds. The education hallway was painted along with a couple of the Little Sprouts rooms. Thanks to the Taylor family, our children's library was painted and organized beautifully. There are plans to re-decorate our parlor with funds from our Memorials; these plans include new carpet, paint and shades.

Those are just the projects you can see. In the last seven years, many joints on the water pipes throughout the building have been replaced. The air handler was replaced (remember not having air conditioning in the sanctuary in 2016?). Various mechanical issues have been addressed in these past seven years, as they have had to be addressed for many years before my time as your pastor.

The fact is, friends, we have a fantastic and very large church building to maintain, along with four other buildings (two parsonages, our caretaker's home and garage/storage facility) on our 39 acre "compound." The most pressing needs in our church building are a chiller (air conditioner) that needs replacing and the floor of our fellowship hall. That is why we are launching a capital campaign that we are calling "Community Central: The Big Chill!"

The goal of this campaign is to replace both the chiller and the floor of our fellowship hall without utilizing any endowment proceeds or Major Gift funds. Our Trustees have diligently sought out estimates for both projects and the total cost of these two projects is \$147,000. In a couple of weeks you will receive a letter outlining our campaign in detail and asking for your participation in making these projects a reality. The chiller is our priority, as we could very well be without air conditioning throughout our building very soon. Please begin praying about this effort now. In light of how much we and our community are blessed by God through our facilities, I am praying for an outpouring of support that will reflect that blessing.

I look forward to seeing you in worship!

An Update on "A Way Forward" Issue of LGBTQ Inclusion Michigan Conference to Vote on Sending Proposed Legislation the General Conference

Bishop Bard has called for a special session of the Michigan Conference on Saturday, March 7th, at Albion College from 1:30 pm-4:30 pm. The purpose of this session will be to consider whether the Michigan Conference will send the legislation based on the "Protocol of Reconciliation and Grace Through Separation" to General Conference 2020 so that it might be considered by the delegates to the General Conference. Because the Protocol was finalized after the deadline for submitting legislation to be considered during the 2020 Session, it needs to be sent to General Conference by one or more Annual Conferences.

Under the rules of The Michigan Conference, general conference legislation is not amendable, so Annual Conference members at the special session will vote to send, or not to send, the legislation brought before them, as is, for action at the 2020 General Conference. It will be Michigan's eight delegates to GC2020 who will be among those voting on the substance of the Protocol and other legislation that comes before the body in Minneapolis, May 5-15.

Rev. Cora and three Central Church members are attending this special session of the Michigan Conference and will update our congregation on the outcome. It is important to note that this special session is not to consider the merits of the Protocol itself, but to determine whether the document will be forwarded it to the 2020 General Conference for consideration during the May General Conference session. Michigan Delegation Co-Chair Laura Witkowski clarified by saying, "We are not the body to determine the final outcome of the Protocol, we are the vehicle to get it to the table. What a blessing it is for the Michigan Conference to lead in this way."

About the Protocol

On January 3, 2020, a diverse, 16-member group of United Methodist bishops and other leaders offered a proposal that would preserve The United Methodist Church while allowing traditionalist-minded congregations to form a new denomination. The separating group would receive \$25 million in United Methodist funds and would keep its local church properties.
