Dear Friends,

As a holy day and a holiday, Christmas is an amalgam of the traditions of a half-dozen cultures, accumulated over centuries. The idea to celebrate the Nativity on December 25 was first suggested in the fourth century in the hope of eclipsing the December 25 festivities of a rival religion that threatened the existence of Christianity. The celebration of Christmas took permanent hold in the Western world in 337, when the Roman emperor Constantine was baptized, uniting for the first time the emperorship and the Church. Christianity became the official state religion, and in A.D. 354, Bishop Liberius of Rome reiterated the importance of celebrating not only Christ's death but also his birth. Many customs have arisen from the celebration of Christmas. The celebration of Advent, whether with wreaths in church or calendars at home, is among these customs. On the one hand, it's one of the major seasons celebrated by most Christian churches in the Western tradition: Roman Catholics, Anglicans, Episcopalians, Lutherans, and many additional Protestant churches mark the roughly month-long period with special observance. Advent has become a period of preparation for Christmas. It has also become the inspiration for elongating the season and festivities to include gift-giving, thought to be inspired by the gifts the Magi brought to Jesus after his birth.

The 12 days of Christmas is the period in Christian theology that marks the span between the birth of Christ and the coming of the Magi, the three wise men. It begins on December 25 (Christmas) and runs through January 6 (the Epiphany, sometimes also called Three Kings' Day). The four weeks preceding Christmas are collectively known as Advent, which begins four Sundays before Christmas and ends on December 24.

Over the years, I have been absolutely startled as the abruptness of the Christmas Season ending on midnight, December 25. But Christmas is a season just like Eastertide. Often I have declared that we, as followers of Christ are "Easter People." I've been thinking about what it would mean to compliment that proclamation with the similar "We are Christmas People!"

To say we are "Christmas People" is to say that we are generous
