This variety show was the first of its kind, and remains the longest-running to date—23 years! The Ed Sullivan Show was renowned for introducing musical talent to American television, including the first Beatles performance. Sullivan also featured many African-American artists and record labels (many from Motown Records). However, one of my favorite acts was the "plate spinners." Broadway were popular, plate spinning is almost always mentioned in articles about The Ed Sullivan Show (along with Topo Gigio who appeared 50 times during the show's run).

One of the reasons I like the plate spinners is that it's a great analogy for life. I often feel like a plate spinner trying to keep a number of programs, studies, and initiatives going at the same time. I am thankful for the more frequent opportunities to visit folks in their homes or in different facilities where they live. I am also working with leadership in our church on putting together a new structure for our ministry, as well as a new in-person worship experience in our chapel. Of course, there are the usual duties of administration, along with caring for our building and working with the many groups and organizations who meet in our wonderful facility.

Recently, a young clergy colleague said there's so much to think about in ministry he was worried about issues of self-care and burnout. While I am certainly no expert, I have learned a few things over the past 38 years of ministry. First, the work is never done! Second, time away to rejuvenate and rest is a gift to the church in the long run. Third, it is the responsibility of a clergy person to model self-care and honor our "Sabbath Time" as a means of being faithful to our calling.

I am reminded about the many elements of our church, from our four goals created a year ago—I) Hunger Ministries, 2) Congregational Care, 3) Online Church and 4) LGBTQ+ Inclusiveness—to working toward an understanding of gun violence and bullying in our schools, continued concerns about COVID-19, and working toward promoting mental health in our lives together.

SO...plate spinning. What plates are you spinning or what responsibilities are you juggling? How might we work together to accomplish God's work in the world, and at the same time care for ourselves and one another? How are you being called by God to join in the endless ministry of our Creator and Savior? Pray with me in answering these questions. I look forward to being with you in worship.

Download the app called "Vanco Mobile Faith Engagement." If you have been giving through GivePlus you will already have an account, although you will have to login and re-select "Central United Methodist Church." There are a few churches named "Central United Methodist Church," so make sure to select the one at 3882 Highland Rd in Waterford. If you can't remember your password use the password reset option to change it. You can continue to give online at Central's website and through text-to-give.
