At the time of that writing, Spafford's ship was directly above the shipwreck site where his four daughters drowned when their ship collided with another. Horatio and his wife, Anna, had five children; their son died of pneumonia in 1871. Spafford was a successful lawyer and businessman in Chicago and his wife and their four daughters had sailed to Europe where Horatio was to join them later. As it turned out, Spafford was on his way to Europe to console his wife and grieve together the loss of their daughters.

As the ship he traveled on was at the place where his daughters perished, Horatio Spafford wrote, "When peace like a river attendeth my way, when sorrows like sea billows roll, whatever my lot, Thou hast taught me to say, it is well, it is well with my soul."

How dare anyone say, "all is well?" Perhaps I should qualify that phrase with the words, "with my soul." Despite the many concerns of this world—and they are many, as well as frightening and depressing—it is well with my soul. I found great respite this past weekend watching the Superbowl with my family, enjoying some yummy food and feeling blessed as we await the news of the birth of our fourth grandchild. (No baby yet!) I also enjoy sharing with our virtual congregation the fact that we will be worshiping in person this next Sunday, February 20th.

Reconciling Church Team

I ask you to prayerfully consider volunteering to lead a short project task force in our church whose goal is to understand what "reconciling" means to Waterford Central United Methodist Church.

At the 2021 planning/visioning meeting we identified the need for a small team to explore what it would mean for WCUMC to become a Reconciling Church. A Reconciling Church within United Methodism is a church that equips and mobilizes United Methodists of all sexual orientations and gender identities to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves. Furthermore, a Reconciling Church is one that adopts, believes, and practices the following statement from the Reconciling Ministries Network:

"We celebrate God's gift of diversity and value the wholeness made possible in community equally shared and shepherded by all. We welcome and affirm people of every gender identity, gender expression, and sexual orientation, who are also of every age, race, ethnicity, physical and mental ability, level of education, and family structure, and of every economic, immigration, marital, and social status, and so much more. We acknowledge that we live in a world of profound social, economic, and political inequities. As followers of Jesus, we commit ourselves to the pursuit of justice and pledge to stand in solidarity with all who are marginalized and oppressed."

Our task force is not automatically assuming we will become a Reconciling Congregation. This short project's mission is to understand what is required to be a Reconciling Ministry, understand how other churches have approached it, and determine what reconciling means and should look like for WCUMC. The task force will then make a recommendation to the church council and then to the congregation.

A lot of work has taken place already. We have already attended webinars on the subject and have met with one local church. This team needs someone to take over the reins for the next few months and help it complete its work.

Little Sprouts Awarded Grant Money

Little Sprouts is thrilled to have been awarded a Child Care Stabilization Grant through the state of Michigan in the amount of \$59,000. Spending must take place by the end of April, and funds must be spent on reimbursement for expenses incurred during closure due to Covid-19 and improvements and materials that enhance our indoor and outdoor school environment. This will enable us to continue providing a safe, supportive learning experience for Waterford-area children and families.

Directors Mary and Monica began planning with the CUMC Little Sprouts Board and Trustee Chair, Ken Cortese, last week to make the best decisions regarding spending and purchases that will directly benefit both Little Sprouts and Central United Methodist Church. These grants are part of a nationwide initiative to increase federal and state funding for high-quality early childhood programming, and to help keep the doors of licensed centers open so they are able to focus on what matters most—supporting children and families!
