Dear Friends,

I just finished my State of the Church report that I write each year for our annual Church Conference. If I were to give my report a theme, I would call it "A Plan Towards a New Normal." I am very much aware of the desire of many of our members and friends to return to "normal," meaning life as it was before the pandemic. As I wrote in my report, there is evidence that we are making strides toward traditions and activities that reflected our lives before Covid-19. I'm not sure that I would call that evidence simply a return to "normal." That is because we may never fully return to life as it was before the pandemic. Rather, we need to move forward with new and innovative ways of living our lives for the balance of 2022 and into 2023.

I've also wondered about the lessons we've learned from the pandemic, of which there are many. I'd like to share just a few. The first is that we need to love and care for one another. Our new District Superintendent, Rev. Dr.

Darryl Totty, gave us a theme scripture for this year's Church Conference. It is John 13:34-35:

"I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

I was proud of our church as we checked in during the pandemic with members and friends, making sure they were safe and had access to food, toiletries and other necessities.

Second, we learned to ask for help. Our staff quickly met and made plans for our worship and praise of God, keeping us connected with one another and with our loving Creator. If not for the technical expertise of our staff and volunteers and great communication among those people, we would not have been able to continue our worship life at Central Church. Now, I count our online worship service as one of the best I've seen. I had to ask for help constantly as I was taught to use new technology. Others had to ask what needed to be done, then explore how to best utilize their gifts and talents.

The third and final lesson I believe we learned from the Covid-19 pandemic is that life is precious. That may seem trite to some; however, it bears repeating. Life is precious. I know plenty of people who are bitter and resentful at the loss of loved ones to whom they were not able to properly say goodbye. I found myself telling people that I loved them when that would not have been



part of a normal conversation. I told people I loved them to fill the void of not being able to demonstrate my love for them.

These lessons are just three of hundreds of lessons we've learned from the pandemic. They are cyclical in nature. Because we love each other, we care for each other and we ask for and offer help to one another. As we move into a new future I want to assure you of two things: God loves you, and I love you. I look forward to seeing you in worship.


