Dear Church Family,

There's an old saying that preaching should comfort the afflicted and afflict the comfortable. It's a fine line upon which to walk as a preacher. Afflict is a very strong word meaning to cause pain and suffering. While I wouldn't want to purposely afflict members of our church, I do want offer messages that challenge our faith and the practice of our faith. I hope that the messages I share answer three questions: 1) What did I learn about God?, 2) What did I learn about myself? and 3) So what?

These questions move us toward a deeper understanding of our relationship with God. In our Christian faith our relationship with God is based on the teaching of Jesus the Christ, who remains the best representation of God in the world. From teaching us about prayer and piety to peace-making and seeking justice, Jesus the Christ offers us a wonderful model of salvation. Salvation means that we have fully received God's forgiveness, forgiven ourselves and are freed from that which separates us from God. When we are "saved" we experience a wholeness and integration in our lives of who we are on the inside with who we are on the outside. There is congruence between what we believe and how we live in the world.

I mentioned in the message yesterday that some of the ways that we can see our faith lived out is by the fruit of the spirit (Galatians 5:22-23). The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. The question to ask ourselves is whether or not these attributes describe our daily interactions with others.

During our series of messages on *Learning to Pray* we've been exploring The Lord's Prayer. There have been several challenges that I've suggested to fully grasp the meaning of this prayer that Jesus specifically taught his followers. The first challenge was to pray The Lord's Prayer daily and then I suggested that we pray it three times a day, which was the practice of the early church.

Another challenge suggested in the devotionals connected with the series is to discover how we can be the answer to The Lord's Prayer. In other words, how can we bring God's kingdom and will to earth as it is in heaven? How will God's name be hallowed through us? When it comes to forgiveness, I borrowed a challenge from those who are in the Alcoholic Anonymous community; a community that knows a great deal about forgiveness and grace. I suggested that we consider steps 8 and 9 of this 12-step program: First, make a list of all persons we have harmed, and become willing to make amends to them all. Second, make direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others. This last challenge will take a few moments, days and possibly weeks to implement into your life.

These challenges are not meant to afflict but rather move us all toward comfort in deepening our relationships with God and each other. As we continue this series of messages, I hope you are feeling spiritually fed as together we examine The Lord's Prayer! I look forward to seeing you in worship.





Born to Eternal Life
