Dear Church Family,

Happy New Year! While we are just four days into the New Year, I would remind our members of the information that I shared with you in my January I message. Experts tell us those who make a New Year's resolution do benefit from making a resolution, and that after I week 75% are still successful in keeping it. However, after two weeks, the number drops to 71%. After I month, the number drops again to 64%. And after 6 months, 46% of people who make a resolution are still successful in keeping it. One study stated that by year's end, that number is down to 8%!

I often muse about our language and it strikes me as funny how we say that we "break" New Year's Resolutions, as if that resolution is no longer valid or useful. The other word we use about resolutions is that we "keep" them. So the question I would ask is—if we break a resolution, we shouldn't keep it? The alternative is to view resolutions as goals, or even a journey. That was the point of this past Sunday's message; we should do things differently if we are expecting new and different results in our lives. The Wise Men, or Magi, "returned to their country by another road." (Matthew 2:12 – GBN). In other words, their path was different after encountering the Christ Child.

I'm really hoping for some changes in my life as we enter a new year. There are some organizational goals I'd like to implement in both my personal and work life. I'd like to get serious about losing some weight; about four years ago I lost 25-30 pounds and have stayed within that range, but it's time to lose more. Ruth and I are also preparing to gather a group of people interested in going to Israel in January of 2024. You may have some similar goals in terms of health, travel or organization.

Here's the thing we need to understand, friends. Resolutions don't really "break." We may drop them, but they bounce; and like a ball, we can retrieve them and continue to utilize that resolution for the purpose of bettering ourselves. That is why I'm beginning a new series of messages on January 15 titled You in X Years. No matter where you set your horizon for your goals—one year, two years or five—where do you want to be within that time frame? This five-part series of messages will help us assess our lives, determine goals and create manageable steps toward those goals.

With determination on our part, inspiration from one another and God's blessings, we can meet our goals and keep bouncing along a different path for real and meaningful change. Again, that series of messages will begin on January 15. This next Sunday, January 8, we will have a hymn sing and
