special opportunities to worship our God and appreciate the life of Jesus Christ, whose presence continues with us today through the Holy Spirit.

The message series this Lent is Jesus and the Psalms. Jesus quotes the Psalms more than any other book of the Hebrew Bible (our Old Testament). As Jesus grew in the faith of his parents and faith community, he would have learned the scriptures from the many times he attended worship with his family. He quoted the scriptures from the moment that he was driven into the wilderness after his baptism to the words he uttered from the cross upon which he died. I was challenged by one of our staff to create this series of messages and it has been a joy to take up that challenge. It is my prayer that we will benefit from listening together to the teachings of Jesus as he quoted scripture and taught his followers to consider deeply the meaning of scripture and how it applied to the time in which he lived.

In this time in which we are watching a war rage on the other side of our earth, combating the ravages of poverty and hunger and mourning the loss of people struck down through gun violence, let's worship together, seek justice, study and pray—the very same things Jesus did when he walked the face of this earth 20 centuries ago.

This past Sunday, I shared some thoughts on the story of Jesus visiting the home of Martha and Mary. While Martha focused on the meal she was preparing for her guest, Mary sat at the feet of Jesus listening to his teachings. When Martha attempted to enlist Jesus' support in getting Mary to help with the food preparation, Jesus commended Mary for she had "chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her." (Luke 10:42) This Lenten season, I invite you to choose the "better part" and spend time with Jesus and his fellow followers. I look forward to seeing you in worship.

Gun Control Advocacy Day 2023

March 22, 8am - 3pm

United Methodists from around the state will be gathering in East Lansing, Michigan, to advocate for gun control legislation. Advocacy day will be a time of prayer, public witness, and meetings with elected officials that will focus on gun safety. There will be three virtual training events prior to Advocacy Day where individuals will learn how to speak with elected officials.

Michigan United Methodists have joined End Gun Violence Michigan, a growing coalition of



clergy, students and educators, physicians, elected officials, and community leaders calling on state legislators to prioritize the passing of common-sense legislation to curb the number of deaths related to gun violence.

There are four legislative issues that are at the heart of End Gun Violence Michigan's advocacy that the group hopes to make a top priority for our elected officials:

- Universal background checks. Close a loophole by changing the wording in the current legislation from "handgun" to "firearm" and pass legislation requiring universal background checks for those purchasing a firearm.
- Safe storage laws for all firearms. There is a need for clear legislation requiring gun owners to
 place their guns in a locking device or a secure holding place to prevent minors or anyone from
 accessing them.

- Extreme risk protection orders. Also known as "red flag laws," these laws would allow a judge to temporarily remove firearms from someone if the judge determines the person may be at risk for harming themselves or others with the firearm.
- Restrictions on domestic abusers. Restricting the ability of persons convicted of sexual assault or domestic violence to buy firearms.

There will be three virtual training events before Advocacy Day where you can learn more about the topic and prepare for your meeting with elected officials. All three sessions will be recorded for you to view later if you cannot attend live. The second and third sessions are required in order to attend the meetings with elected officials, to make sure you are well prepared. There will also be a virtual debrief after the event to share key learning and next action steps. Registration is \$20, which will help cover lunch and related expenses, and scholarships are available from the Michigan Conference.

- Archived worship services (from the home page, or the menu: Worship=>Worship Archive)




