Years ago in the church I was serving, I was convinced that I needed to address the post 9-11 anxiety some were feeling with a series of messages on fear and stress. While many expressed appreciation for my effort, one parishioner said to me, "I'm trying to learn from your series on stress but frankly, it's just stressing me out!"

I tell you that brief anecdote first to share another, more recent encounter. Even before our Advent Message Series titled *Christmas is Not Your Birthday*, I've had some folks wonder aloud to me, "What are you going to say? You even seem nervous about the series." I am a bit anxious about this series given the financial conditions we all are facing, from inflation to recession, fixed incomes and dropping stock profiles.

This series of messages is designed to inspire our community of faith to take seriously the mission and message of Christmas. We will explore the truest and deepest meaning of God breaking into human history through the birth of Jesus the Christ. The challenge that Rev. Mike Slaughter put forth to his congregation when he developed this series and the subsequent book was for people to spend the same amount of money on helping others as they spent on themselves for Christmas. The focus of Ginghamsburg UMC was to provide funds to help people in the Darfur region of Sudan. In the last ten years, that large UMC has given millions of dollars to that mission.

It's not that we haven't taken the mission of Christmas seriously in the past, but this may be the first time I've suggested that we consider matching our Christmas giving with our Christmas spending on ourselves. Join me in discovering how we might live more simply so that others can simply live. As we share the love of God through Christ in our community and world, let's be mindful of what we can do for others. I look forward to seeing you in worship.
