He has taught and held several positions at Northwest State Community College for over 40 years. Dr. Zachrich has served as a business professor, Dean of Business, Dean of Engineering Technologies, and Dean of Arts & Sciences.

What I want to glean from our summer message series, *The Twelve*, is how we can determine our own legacy as followers of Christ. I invite you to watch the introductory message from this past Sunday and then join us throughout the summer to delve into the lives of the men who were The Twelve. I look forward to seeing you in worship!
