Dear Friends,

With the message this next Sunday, August 6, we will be half-way through our Summer Message Series titled *The Twelve*. An important part of this series of messages is also considering our own legacy as we learn about the lives of the twelve men who closely followed Jesus and knew him best. We can learn a great deal about some of these men through our scripture and additional ancient writings. With the others in *The Twelve* we can glean precious little; two of them we know nothing about except that they are listed as members of *The Twelve*.

Immediate and first impressions are important. Dr. Larry Zachrich, in his book, *Determining Your Legacy: The Power of Lasting Impressions*, writes, "We quickly decide if a person deserves a second look. Traits are inferred spontaneously and decisions which utilize the information are determined automatically. The

ability to effortlessly judge a person 'serves as an initial pass that may determine the likelihood of seeking additional information (i.e., whether to approach or avoid a given individual)." (Page 37 – with references to an article in *Journal of Personality and Social Psychology* titled "Half a Minute: Predicting Teacher Evaluation from Thin Slices of Nonverbal Behavior and Physical Attractiveness" by Nalini Ambady and Robert Rosenthal).

The point of sharing that quote is that we make quick decisions about people with very little knowledge about them. Dr. Zachrich writes further that these quick assessments of others can be very accurate. He also mentions that it is very difficult to change our initial impressions. There are times when you need an avalanche of information in order to reverse a first impression.

I can't count the number of people who have commented on our messages from this summer; especially the message about Judas Iscariot. With limited exposure to *The Twelve*, it is my hope that we will consider our own legacies and how we, the church, impact the world around us that is constantly and quickly making judgments about us.

I encourage us all to always be aware of our actions and how we are perceived by others. We may not get a second chance to make a positive impression for the sake of the church and our witness of Jesus the Christ! I sincerely hope you are having a blessed summer and I look forward to seeing you in worship.

Funds From This Sale Will Benefit:

UMC Michigan Conference Children's Defense Fund (CDF) Freedom School Program

- The Freedom School Program operates in two sites in Detroit and Flint: The program is a six-week summer literacy and cultural enrichment program designed to serve children and youth in grades K-12 in communities where quality academic enrichment programming is limited, too expensive, or nonexistent.
- The goal is to increase the capacity of the Michigan Conference to continue to support and expand the number of children and youth served through new sites across the state of Michigan.

UMC Michigan Conference Liberia Scholarship Program.

- Many people who live in Liberian communities earn less than a dollar a day. Families must often choose if they can afford to send any of their children to school. The Liberia Scholarship Program aims to raise funds for 100 students for eight years of schooling and to support four of the poorest schools in Liberia by providing access to clean water, flush toilets, and new science and computer labs.
- Central Church has been actively involved with Liberia activities. Through member commitment and generous donations Central provides annual scholarships to 24 students at the C. W. Duncan UMC School in Monrovia, Liberia. Funds raised through the Readers to Leaders campaign address needs at different Liberian UMC schools.
