

UPCOMING IN WORSHIP

Sunday, September 17th Pastor Jack continues our message series with *The Twelve: Matthew the Tax Collector.* Worship is in person or online at Live.WaterfordCUMC.org

Dear Friends,

What is your vision for the church? What would be your vision for our church? How have you experienced your best expectations of a church? In the book of Acts, shortly after the coming of the Holy Spirit to be among humanity, we can read a description of what life was like for that young and growing community of faith. Acts 2:46-47 reads, "Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved."

There are four basic activities that defined these early church people. First, they spent time studying in the Temple and second, they broke bread together. Breaking bread has two meanings; they are meals together and shared in what they understood to be

the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Third, they enjoyed each other in a fellowship that was glad and generous. Finally, they praised and worshiped God. We're told that the people who were observing the church in its infancy liked what they saw! These two verses conclude with the positive result that "day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved."

So, there is a fifth attribute of the early church that is evident in this description; the church was growing. This past Sunday was Rally Sunday and, admittedly, it was a rather low-key celebration of transitioning from summer to our busier fall schedule of activities. While I was putting yummy food on my plate at the potluck, a member of our church said to me, "Pastor Jack, turn around and just look at this!" What I saw were people who, after worshiping God and learning about Simon the Zealot (part of our message series titled *The Twelve*), were breaking bread together and enjoying each other's presence in warm and friendly fellowship.

AND....there was nearly a dozen people who are fairly new to our church community. We engaged in all four attributes of the early church described in Acts AND experienced the potential for our church to grow! It was a very exciting morning and early afternoon. The food, the fellowship and the fun were great!

I just wanted to point out how we are living into the best Biblical expectations of the early church. I ask you to consider all that means for us twenty centuries later as we are experiencing God's blessings. Join me in celebrating Central Church as we enter this great time of the year. I look forward to seeing you in worship!

Rose Smith's Fabulous Orange Fluff

2 medium containers of cottage cheese 2 containers of Coolwhip
