This study guide is designed for you to daily, throughout this next week, consider the lessons of today's message and delve further into scripture that will enhance your growth as a Christian.

Monday, September 25

Think about people in your lives that either profess no faith or are not living out their faith in a church community. Write their names here.

Read the gospel lesson from yesterday – Luke 10:1-20. Consider what it meant for Jesus to send those seventy to share their faith. Tuesday, September 26

Read the parable of the Fig Tree – Luke 13:6-9. This is a parable about God expecting a harvest from our lives. What harvest could God expect from your life? In the parable, the owner of the fig tree wants it cut down because it bears no fruit. The gardener replied by asking the owner to wait a year while he fertilizes the tree with manure. How can your soul be fed that you may bear fruit for God's harvest? What changes should you make in order to be productive in your ministry? Write your thoughts here and ask God to show you can meet God's expectation of a harvest from your life.

Wednesday, September 27

Read Matthew 22:34-40. What does it mean to love God with all your heart, soul and mind? How can you love God with each of these elements of your life? A big clue to loving God s the second commandment Jesus shared – to love our neighbor as ourselves. How can you love your neighbors better? Could you invite them to a worship service at Central United Methodist Church or a special program that might be of interest to them? How is your love for God demonstrated each day? What are others seeing in you and your life that would make them also want to love God? Write your thoughts here and pray for guidance and courage to share your love of God and neighbor.

Thursday, September 28

Read Romans 12:2 and Micah 6:8. How is your life conformed to this world? What might you have to give up in order to be "transformed by the renewing of your mind?" What things are you doing to "do justice," "love kindness," and "walk humbly with your God?" Write your thoughts here.

In Matthew 25 we learn that when we do good for others, we are performing those tasks for Jesus. Does that knowledge help you have more courage in your witness? End your time of reflection in silence visualizing how the world could be better because of you!
