## Dear Friends,

When do you "get into the Christmas Spirit?" That's a strange question that is asked in a variety of ways. We might say, "Have you caught the Christmas Spirit?" as if it is a contagion that is transferred from others. Perhaps you've heard someone say, "The Christmas Spirit just hasn't hit me yet." as if the Spirit is somehow an assault on your inner being. What I am asking you is when do you feel that you are connected to what Christmas is all about?

That last question has changed for me over the seasons of my life. When I was a child the Elks Club had a family gathering on the first or second Saturday in December. My father, who was very proud of being an Elk, would load up the family to go to the lodge to be with other families, eat a yummy meal and meet with Santa to receive the first gift of Christmas. I was always amazed how Santa would know just what to get each child in attendance that



day. Then we would go home and that was always the evening when Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer was televised (the one with Hermey the Misfit Elf and Yukon Cornelius). What a day!

As a teen, I enjoyed Christmas Eve the most, which was a little late for catching the Christmas Spirit. The Candlelight Service with the choir and singing was always a treat. As I moved into adulthood, I have tried to get into the Christmas Spirit early and often; a particular hymn or Christmas song will usher in that Spirit which lightens my mood and creates within me a joyfulness grounded in the hopes of Christ being born once again into our world and my life.

As I have written before, during Advent we are utilizing the work of Whitney R. Simpson, a Deaconess in the United Methodist Church and founder of Exploring Peace Ministries. Whitney is certified in the area of Spiritual Formation and seeks to help people fulfill their greatest potential. I have prepared some experiential moments during my messages in Advent and it is my plan that these will help our congregation embody a meaningful and deeply felt Spirit of Christmas. Simpson writes, "Embodiment means that we give life to an idea. It requires that we take on that idea and personify it in ourselves. In the context of our faith, embodiment means that we give shape to our thoughts, actions feelings, and intentions through our physical self." (Fully Human, Fully Divine, page 17).

It is my prayer that you will "get into the Christmas Spirit" so the ideas of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love will become your thoughts, actions, and intentions as enter this Advent Season of 2023! I look forward to seeing you in worship. May God bless you!

## Year-End Stewardship Snapshot

In my message on November 17<sup>th</sup> I shared these words about trusting the market over our maker (or master, to use the words of the parable from which I was sharing the message): "We make that mistake ourselves, don't we? We fail to trust our God who has given us such amazing talents to use in our personal and congregational lives. So often, we do not appreciate the abilities we have been given to tutor a child, encourage a friend, plan a budget, cook a meal, teach a class, coach a team, mentor a colleague, play an instrument or do a repair for a neighbor. The use of these gifts can enhance our own lives and advance the mission and ministry of Jesus. And that is what we need here are Central United Methodist Church; your talents—and to be clear I'm talking about both definitions of talents for today—both your abilities and your financial resources. For years, we've trusted the market here at Central Church and our budget has run on a deficit for decades; we have what was once a very healthy endowment. While I would have to say that it is more than what a lot of churches have in reserves, it is not what it used to be. And the last two years the market has been unkind to us; the market has been unkind to us all."

People have wondered about the financial future of Central Church and I have three questions to ask our members and friends.

- Is there a way in which you can give beyond your Generosity Pledge? This giving could be a year-end gift from your Required Mandatory Distribution from an IRA account. Or, could you make a plan in 2024 to gift some of your tax return to Central Church?
- 2. Is Central Church in your will? As you have made plans for your property and financial resources to go to family and friends and perhaps some organizations that are important to you, have you considered leaving some of those resources to your church?
- 3. Can you increase your Generosity Pledge for 2024?

I ask these questions not from a perspective of desperation but rather from the perspective that I know that Central Church is near and dear to the hearts of our members and friends. As I said during our Generosity Campaign in October, your giving toward the ministry of Central Church in 2024
