Knit for Kids

A BIG thank to you those who have been busy knitting sweaters, baby blankets, hats, scarves and mittens for the Knit for Kids project. Also, thanks to those who have donated yarn. We are in need of full skeins of colored yarn, but please no more white or beige, as we have lots of that in our supply. Four shipments were sent out in 2023 at a cost of \$135. Our expenses are mostly covered by the Compassionate Christmas card project, but fortunately there were other donations this past year to help cover the cost.

We received a thank you from World Vision, who distributes the knit items in the US and around the world—most recently to Afghanistan, Burundi, the Congo, Lesotho, Niger, Sierra Leone, Somalia Swaziland, Zambia and warehouses in Chicago, Dallas, and Hartford.

Since our first shipment in 2006, we have provided 1,758 sweaters, 1,255 baby hats, 737 kids hats, 551 pairs of mittens, 115 baby blankets and 37 scarves. If you wish to participate, knit and crochet patterns and yarn are available on a table outside the Bride's Room just beyond the Narthex. Once your project is completed, please place it on the table. 
