are also outreach opportunities as we support the HAVEN Shelter, Jail and Outreach Ministries (Pontiac), and Central's Food Pantry. In that brochure are all the special services that we will host from Ash Wednesday through Good Friday and our Easter Sunrise Service. Come be a part of these opportunities to worship our God and appreciate the life of Jesus Christ, whose presence continues with us today through the Holy Spirit.

The message series this Lent is Jesus and the Prophets. We will learn about the true nature of Biblical prophecy. I will discuss how the proclamation of the prophets, although addressing the contemporary issues of their day, also points to Jesus as the fulfillment of their long desire for the Messiah to appear and lead their people from oppression to freedom. Some of the prophets provide a study in contrast to Jesus, while others provide a vision of how we will know the Messiah has arrived. I am getting excited to present this series of messages and hope that we all will benefit from them.

This past Sunday, I shared some thoughts on Jesus' confrontation with a Pharisee who was testing him by asking which commandment was the greatest. Jesus responded, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:37-39). Jesus went on to say, "On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets." (Verse 40) I look forward to sharing the connections between Jesus and the Prophets and how the center of their messages is love—love for God and love for others. I look forward to seeing you in worship.


