

Dear Central Church Family,

Once again I feel compelled to express thanks to our Central Church Family as Ruth and I are still walking the road of grief after the deaths of Ruth's mother and my father. The cards with wonderfully personal expressions of love and support are far too many to display and are actually in stacks that, all together, are over a foot high! Thank you.

The death of my father at nearly 89 years of age—his birthday is March 13—is very different than the death of my mother at age 57. I have long believed in life that is eternal as a result of more than church dogma, creeds and traditions. However, when my mother died, my belief became very real and vitally important to me. It's been 28 years since Mom died and that belief is still just as vital and important to me as when Dad died a little more than a month ago.

My belief in eternal life is connected to what we are moving towards during this season of Lent, specifically the resurrected life made

possible by the life, teachings, death and resurrection of Jesus. And my friends, the difference between eternal life and resurrected life is that resurrection life began when I first uttered the words that I believed in Jesus as my Lord and Savior and asked for forgiveness as I repented of my sins.

While heaven and eternal life became more real to me when my mother died, that "realness" is now woven deep within my soul and life on this side of eternity. I am definitely a different person than I was 28 years ago. I'm writing this on a Monday morning with an appointment this afternoon to plan a funeral for one of our members, and I've just learned about the death of another of our members. Even as I continue to grieve for my mother-in-law and father, I am already grieving for these members of our church family. We will celebrate as we recognize that their lives are different because of their relationship with our loving creator and savior.

Our changed lives are a result of turning toward our God and turning away from anything that separates us from God; we call that turning away from sin and toward God "repentance." Rabbi David Wolpe of Los Angeles' Sinai Temple has something to say about that: not about the Christian Lent, but about his own people's day of repentance, Yom Kippur: "One of the great things about repentance is that it doesn't only change the future, it changes the past: because if you become a different person, then all those mistakes and regrets and anguish, instead of sadnesses they become stepping-stones to the new person that you have created inside of yourself ..." (Rabbi David Wolpe, in a "Moments of Connection" video distributed online on September 10, 2021.)

As we are halfway through Lent with very busy weeks leading up to Easter, may we rejoice in our lives that are changed by our Lord who would lay down his life for our changed lives. I look forward to seeing you in worship. God bless you!
