There is often resistance to the transformative work of the church. This should be an indication of the importance of the work.

## Thursday, September 26

Read Acts 1:1-8. We are called to be "witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Verse 8) These words represent an ever expanding ring of influence of an individual and the church. A witness is one who shares what he or she knows to be true.

What do you know to be true about God and Jesus Christ? What do you know to be true about the church? Can you share your experience? Perhaps a story of acceptance in our church?
