## Daily Devotional Guide

The following is a daily devotional and study guide meant to enhance your understanding of the message and grow as a Christian.

#### Monday, October 14

What do you think of when you hear the words "Called by God?" or "What's your calling?" Often people think of callings as a passion; something a person really enjoys. However, there are

times when people are called to participate in unpleasant tasks. What do you think? To what have you been called to in the past? Meditate on these questions and write your reflections here.

### **Tuesday, October 15**

Read I Corinthians 15:1-11 and Isaiah 6:1-8. Pastor Jack shared that both the Apostle Paul and the Prophet Isaiah were unlikely candidates for God to call to a mission and ministry. He listed many other examples of unlikely servants. Which represents your favorite Bible Story? Is there a call story from our scriptures that was not mentioned in the message (Jonah, for example)? What makes a person worthy of God's call? What attributes does that person need in order to successfully respond to God's call upon his or her life? Remember the two attributes that Pastor Jack mentioned (a willingness to submit to God's call and the belief that God will equip the call). How did the Biblical people mentioned finally respond to God's call? Write your thoughts here.

### Wednesday, October 16

In her book, *The Stories We Live – Finding God's Calling All Around Us*, Kathleen Cahalen writes a sentence that illustrates the many ways that God calls us to not only mission and ministry but to life, relationships and situations. That sentence is "I and called *by* God, *to* follow, *as* I am, *from* grief, *for* service, <u>in</u> suffering, *through* others, *within* God." The highlighted prepositions in that sentence reveal a different dimension of our callings. For example being called *from* grief means that what breaks your heart compels you to move to a compassionate response. Read the sentence a couple more times and meditate on it, specifically the prepositions. How have you experience a calling from God? What were you doing at the time? Who was with you? What was the situation in which you thought you might be able to respond to
