Dear Friends,

One of my favorite Bible passages from the birth narrative found in Matthew and Luke is the telling of the good news of Jesus' birth to the shepherds in Luke. The shepherds were tending their flocks when suddenly the "glory of the Lord shone all around them." I'm not sure what the glory of the Lord shining around a person looks like, however, we are told that the shepherds were terrified. I imagine in this day, we would wonder how the special effects of "God's glory" were produced. The shepherds in first-century Palestine had no possibility of special effects, so I fully believe they were frightened.

An angel of the Lord appeared to the shepherds to put their minds at ease. Luke 2:10 tells us, "But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid; for see – I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people."" The shepherds are first told not to be afraid and then they are told that the angel is bringing them good news.

I notice a couple of things about the angel's proclamation to the shepherds. First, good news seems to be an antidote to fear. There is so much fear in the world today—from economic difficulties and relationship difficulties to random acts of violence, the wars in Ukraine and the Middle East to natural disasters like hurricanes, floods and wildfires. As one parishioner said, "It's a scary world!" But good news alleviates fear and moves us beyond fear's accompanying paralysis.

The second thing I notice about the angel's proclamation is that the good news is "for all the people." There is no limitation on who should receive the good news of Jesus' birth. All people can receive the blessings of Jesus' birth. Even in our pluralistic world, the proclamation of Jesus' birth should be a blessing to all people because those who receive fully the blessings of Jesus' birth are inspired to act in loving and kind ways, seeking justice and peace for all humanity.

As I anticipate the good news of Jesus' birth during this Advent Season, I want to share some good news with you as we fast approach Christmas and the New Year. I simply want to list them and ask that you share in this good news:

Our attendance in recent months and especially this November has increased while our Sunday morning children's program has increased as well. Patty Stroup, our Director of Life Long Faith Formation, has done a tremendous job in creating a program that is attracting more and more families and their children.

Our Chancel Choir, under the direction of Dr. Aran Kim, has grown to over 20 members on a regular basis and they will share for the first time since the Covid-19 pandemic a Cantata on Sunday, December 15.

There is great interest in all the outreach and educational programs that we are producing for this time of year, from supporting our Good Samaritan Fundraiser, our partnerships with the Baldwin Center, Methodist Children's Home and Clothe-a-Child to our new Stress Buster sessions on Mondays (11am and 7pm) and Coach Patty's Thursday classes (11am and 6:30pm)
