What do you think of when you hear those two words, "perfect time?" During the message, Pastor Jack mentioned three things that make us wait for the "perfect time." First is the "it" that we are waiting for, whatever "it" is for you. Second is us. What needs to happen within us to make this the perfect time? Third is what needs to happen in the lives of others to tie everything together to create the fullness of time. Think about what you would life for God to do in your life. Read Matthew 1:18-25. The question was asked concerning how we are to live while waiting. Three suggestions were mentioned: 1) waiting with the Golden Rule in mind, 2) wait with God's goodness in mind and 3) wait with the end in mind. God truly wants to give us all that we need to live life abundantly so our waiting is not to be a passive time in our lives when we just...waiting! We need to be treating others well, as we would want to be treated, we need to respond to God's goodness and spread that goodness to others and we need to keep the end results that we want in mind.
