The subtitle of the book is Who's Leaving, Why Are They Going, and What Will It Take to Bring Them Back? Even though I had everything I needed from the book in the article I read, I bought the book to study further this phenomenon that has affected all Christian faith traditions. To quote the book about the second phase of the author's research, "Phase 2 found that no theological tradition, age group, ethnicity, political affiliation, education level, geographical location, or income bracket escaped the dechurching in America." 
Hope Shelter Update

Thank you Central Church friends who are dropping items at the Hope Shelter donation box. In November of 2024 we delivered socks, underwear, undershirts, hats and two boxes of hygiene items (soaps, lotions, shampoos, etc.). They were appreciated!

When these items were delivered to Hope Shelter in Pontiac, we learned the current shelter needs include travel-sized toothpaste, earbuds (to listen to music), and ear plugs (foam plugs used to block out sound when sleeping). Also, they can always use men's boxer underwear and men's undershirts in sizes medium to 2X. Please leave the items in the Hope Shelter wood donation box outside of the Chapel at Central Church and they will be delivered to Hope.

Hope Shelter was founded in 1998 in Pontiac as a seasonal warming center following the death of an individual from hypothermia who was not able to access a shelter because he had been drinking. HOPE began providing year-round low-barrier shelter (no sobriety requirement and no background check) in 2014. A second recuperative shelter was opened in 2015. It is a "discharge to home" option from the hospital when an individual is homeless.

Over the years Central Church has supported HOPE Shelter by providing home-cooked meals and donations of clothing and hygiene items. Visit the Hope Shelter website (www.hopeshelters.org) to learn more about the services offered and current needs.
