This past Sunday I was excited to begin our latest Message Series based on the work of Rev. Dr. Michael Slaughter, Pastor Emeritus of Ginghamsburg United Methodist Church in Tipp City, Ohio. In the midst of health and relational crises, Pastor Slaughter created an acronym to capture the principles that would bring healing and wholeness to himself and others.

That acronym is DRIVE. The "D" of DRIVE stands for **Devotion** to God. "R" stands for **Readiness** for lifelong learning. "I" denotes **Investing** in key relationships. "V" indicates **Vision** for the future. "E" stands for **Eating** and **Exercise**. I want to share these messages with you early enough in 2025 that you and I might utilize the ideas behind them to bring lasting change to our lives. This past week I focused on our Devotion to God, illustrating that our Devotion to God is deserved, as Jesus demonstrated God's devotion to us through his life, teachings and dedication to caring for others.

2025 Men's Summit Coming Soon January 31–February 2, 2025

Fueling Kids' Futures (Formerly Blessings in a Backpack)

January 2025 is here, students are back in school, and we are packing bags of food for some students to take home for the weekends. This year we are packing food for approximately 220 students in three Waterford schools: Donelson Hills, Riverside, and Knudsen Elementary.

Fueling Kids' Futures is part of a program involving 17 other communities in SE Michigan. Volunteers from our church and other groups help in packing and delivering the bags of weekend food. The food we pack is purchased from Kroger and funded through donations made by individuals, churches, community organizations and businesses. The cost per child for a year of weekend food is \$160.00.
