Dear Friends,

I am writing this *Chimes* letter to you after completing a new member class. Our new member sessions, or Partnership Classes, are based on the membership vows recited and responded to during a worship service. The final module that I share is based on the membership vow which states, "As members of this congregation, will you faithfully participate in its ministries by your prayers, your presence, your gifts, your service and your witness?"

These are pretty clear ways to relate and be an active member of our church, or any church. I always ask that new members pray for our church and for me as their pastor. I ask them to prayerfully consider how they will support our church through their financial gifts as well as the personal gifts and talents that they can offer. I share the many ways through which they can serve our church, whether behind the scenes (filling our candles with oil, preparing

communion, working in the kitchen) or by serving as "Sunday morning servants" (lay readers, choir members, greeters and ushers). There are many committee positions that need interested and willing people to move our mission and ministries forward.

But what of that part of the vow to "witness?" What does that mean? Being a witness is simply sharing what you know to be true, just like on a witness stand in a court room. Witnessing involves telling others about your faith and the difference it has made in your life. It is about telling what you know to be true about your experience of God, Jesus our Savior and the work of the Holy Spirit through the church and in our world. You can share how being a believer in God has made a difference in your life. You can tell how your life has change by being a part of our local congregation.

To that end we will launch later this month our "21 Days of Hope Easter Experience." For the three weeks leading up to Easter you will receive emails and texts guiding you daily on how you can witness through your prayers and interaction with others, whether those folks are your closest family and friends or a stranger. It is my hope that many people in our church will take up this daily challenge to witness to our faith. Most days, it will only take a few minutes to a half an hour to participate in this 21 days that could change your life and the lives of others. We will be sharing information about how to get involved with this program on Sunday.

Lent can be a joyful season of growing in your relationship with God and others. Through our witness may others learn of God's love for each and every one of us. As always, I look forward to seeing you in worship!

Organ Repair

Our church is blessed with a full-sized pipe organ built by one of the most renowned Canadian organ companies, CasaVant Freres. These past few Sundays you may have noticed a high pitched, slightly disturbing sound, which is coming from a leak in one of the organ pipes. Correcting this will require an important repair, as due to this issue one of the three manuals (keyboards) is not

playable. We are also not able to tune the organ until this issue is resolved.

We have had an organ company diagnose the problem and put together a repair estimate, which is \$4551. Our plan is to raise these funds through a special giving campaign. Please prayerfully consider donating to help fix our organ.

While this repair cost may seem high, by way of reference a full-sized pipe organ similar to ours would cost between \$500,000 to \$1,000,000 new. We are blessed to have such a wonderful instrument and we need to do our best to keep it maintained and in good shape. To donate to the organ repair fund, mark checks with "organ repair" on the memo line or give online to the organ repair fund. Any donation amount is appreciated.
