### Dear Friends,

It's been a busy summer and we've had a lot of fun. From VBS in June to our Adventure Camp last week, families have had a great time learning about God and the Bible, not to mention getting lots of practical, hands-on learning.

Our VBS this year was *Joseph's Journey from Prison to Palace*. It was an evening event and families were encouraged to attend together. The Egyptian-theme program featured a marketplace where they could make jewelry, interact with live animals and learn about their care, print their name in hieroglyphics at the Art Shop, learn about embalming (in a fun way), play Egyptian games in the Toy Shop, make bricks to build a pyramid and sing, dance and play in the Pyramid Playground.

We also had mission projects during VBS. We tied fleece blankets which were donated locally through Operation Kid-to-Kid, a

service mission for kids. We also collected new and gently used coats to give to Micah 6 Communities, and we collected funds that went to Central's Food Pantry. So, families had a lot of opportunity to learn about the importance of giving back and supporting one another.

On the final day we constructed an actual pyramid using the bricks we built and we also created a virtual pyramid of "God Sightings" during the closing ceremony. This helped families look around them and appreciate the beauty and wonder of God's Creation.

During Adventure Camp for Kids, which was last week, fourteen K-5th graders spent four half-days in Bible study and also learned about Weird Animals (day 1), participated in a Wacky Olympics (day 2), learned First Aid and Camp Stuff (day 3) and practiced farming skills on Hay Day (day 4). The kids had great fun and got good and messy.

Our youth have also been busy this summer during Youth Group, enjoying activities ranging from movies to hiking to playing gaga ball. We also took an overnight trip to Cedar Point on possibly the hottest, most humid weekend of the summer, but a good time was had by all. We had youth participate as shopkeepers at VBS; it was a big project and they were fantastic! The youth are also tending the berry garden on-site, which will provide fresh berries for our food pantry. The garden is Delayna Jade's Gold Award for Girl Scouts.

As I'm sure you know by now, I am headed back to Colorado at the end of July. I've enjoyed working with everyone at Central, helping to revitalize your family ministry during my two years here. I've recruited several committed volunteers that I know will continue this ministry while you find someone new to take over and keep the momentum strong! You all hold a special place in my heart and I hope that if you're ever in Colorado you'll look me up! Thanks for the opportunity to work with all of you to build God's kingdom!
